## THE REPORT FROM SABBATICAL ... AND BEYOND!

While I've been "back in the saddle" following my sabbatical since the beginning of July, this is the first *Pastor's Pen* I've had occasion to write since being back. And much has happened!

I want to extend a huge public thank you to all of you for making that sabbatical possible, to those of you who sent cards and letters to stay connected, and to Pastor Ben for so capably leading you through the valley of the shadow with so many funerals, especially the sudden and untimely death of our beloved brother in Christ, Eric Anderson. No, Barry and I never did make it to Scotland or Ireland. Life had a way of intervening. I spent nearly three weeks in Rockford, Illinois moving my mother into a continuing care senior living community and cleaning out her house. But in the midst of all that, we ended up visiting either the emergency room or urgent care with her health uncertainties three times. Meanwhile, Barry's dad was in and out of the hospital three times (90 miles from her, west of Chicago). He is now in a nursing home situation, and we sold and emptied his condo. Barry had surgery for a torn meniscus in his knee the end of April. So as you can see, I would have had to take a leave of absence if that sabbatical had not already been on the schedule!

Still, I was able to accomplish much of what I had hoped to do. With the help of our sister in Christ, Dianne Markwell, I made huge strides de-cluttering our house and my offices at home and at church. And I was able to make it to Houston and Chicago for training and conferences on what we call the GPS process here at Holy Cross. We made it to Toronto where I was trained in Godly Play - that's a Montessori approach to faith formation for children. (Visit [godlyplay.org](http://godlyplay.org) to learn more). I also attended a lecture in Toronto with Lauren Artress, the international guru of labyrinths. I was able to connect with her and talk with her about our labyrinth and training facilitators here. You'll be hearing lots more about all of this in the months ahead.

Most importantly, I had time with Barry and my family. A highlight was an evening with my nephew, Jake Runestad, whose award-winning choral composition was performed at the Valparaiso University Chapel by the National Lutheran Choir. While it was a break that was very much needed, I wouldn't call it much of a rest. But it was what I needed to be doing!

Now, as of August 1, we are so privileged to have Dr. Michael Burkhardt on our staff *permanently* as Cantor  $\frac{3}{4}$  time. This is one of those "win/win" situations: Michael's unique leadership makes so much possible as we live out our mission and into our vision. Along with Pastor Ben, this team makes it possible for me to hand off some of my responsibilities and cut back to  $\frac{3}{4}$  time myself. This gives me the flexibility I need at this point in my life to tend to family responsibilities in Illinois. This trio of a leadership team, consisting of Michael, Pastor Ben, and me, is truly a gift and a blessing for me and I know it will be for Holy Cross as well. Thanks be to God!

## hearts, hands and voices resumes September 9

All children of the community, grades 2-7, are invited into a continuation of the summer camp worship and arts experience during the school year. Each Monday evening, children gather at 6:30 p.m. for a light supper and then work with Michael Burkhardt until 8:00 p.m. Monday night experiences include singing, ringing hand bells, playing Orff instruments, and African drumming.

Participants come from across the region and from a wide variety of faith communities. One of the goals of the program is to equip these children to return to their own communities and lead others in what they have learned. Additionally, these young people develop relationships that carry beyond their time together in the program.

“Tuition” for the program asks each family to provide one supper per term (Fall and Spring).


The Adult Choir rehearses from 7:30-9:00 p.m. on Wednesday evenings throughout the year and leads worship weekly and on feast days.

## *Final Report from the Minister of Worship and Music Call Committee*

(8/1/13)

I write to give you a final update on how the Holy Spirit has once more been active in our midst. In early February the Church Council commissioned this committee to search for a Minister of Worship and Music. It turned out that the mix of people serving on the committee was an unexpected gift (or perhaps a bit of “Holy Spirit Stuff”). Of the nine members, six had served on the previous committee that started this work a year ago, and five are also serving on the current Church Council. In many respects, that overlap made both the direction and the outcome of our process possible.

The first step we took revisited the job description in light of the mission and vision of Holy Cross with a keen eye and ear to what was unfolding before us. Recall what was happening at the time: Pastors Dana and Ben had started to hit their stride as a pastoral team, GPS was emerging as a formative influence on us all, and our community was coming off a powerful Advent & Christmas season of worship. About the same time, Pastor Dana preached a key sermon identifying worship as “God breathing in and breathing out.” Painting that picture helped us identify the central role worship plays in our life together and how integral music is to that role. Being able to articulate our priorities as clearly as we did speaks volumes about our way forward, not only for the benefit of Holy Cross but also in inspiring potential candidates. What we communicated attracted a number of highly accomplished musicians. One college department head called saying she wished she were able to apply to serve in such a vibrant worship community. In the end we were talking to three fine candidates, each who had the potential to be a good fit.

All of this inspired a parallel discernment by your Church Council. Not only did our call committee work inspire candidates around the country, it ended up inspiring one already in our midst. That happy result actually took the committee’s charge off our table as the Church Council (with five members of our Call Committee) began exploring a unique leadership structure that included calling Michael Burkhardt to serve a pivotal role as we move forward. Having Michael feel called to remain at Holy Cross was nowhere near our radar when we embarked on our search, and clearly exceeded our wildest expectations. The convergence of events to make it possible can only be attributed to “Holy Spirit Stuff.”

I know that the work this committee did laid much of the groundwork for what is emerging...both from Michael’s perspective and from the Council’s. Please join me in thanking them for their time, their steadfastness and for trusting in the Holy Spirit to guide us. Members of the Call Committee were: Lynda Ashbay, Cindy Channey, Pat Ferrari, Andy Heise, Lynette Hoelter, Melodie Provencher, Pastor Dana and Pastor Ben.
