has led to widespread devastation and deaths by starvation.

The matter becomes even more desperate due to the people's belief in spiritual diviners. Many tribesmen are blaming the crop failures on "rainmakers" and others who supposedly have powers over nature. Many "diviners" have been attacked and killed as hunger drives men to madness. *May Christ shine His Light on the South Sudanese and bring healing to their land.*
