We are flooded with news this month...including news of flooding!

Hope4Sudan team members arrived on November 2<sup>nd</sup> to begin ministering to the physical needs of Toposa tribesmen in our area. Their plans included three different mobile clinic sites – here in Kapoeta, as well as in two other village areas.

This is normally the perfect time of year to travel to villages, so we weren't expecting complications during their trip. However, it started raining really *hard* after their arrival. By Day 3 the roads were destroyed, and the team was stuck at camp. After much prayer and with a lot of determination, we decided to venture out on the 4<sup>th</sup> day to the nearby village of Lomilmil. What would normally have been a 40-minute drive turned into

hours of waiting (and picture-taking) as we watched for someone to come and tow the massive mobile clinic vehicle out of deep mud. What an adventure!



Despite the complications of this trip, the team was still able to treat a total of 241 patients during their brief time here. The locals were very grateful for their sacrifice not just in coming here, but also in battling the weather to be Christ's hands and feet to the village.

We were grateful to have very capable interpreters for team members this year. All of these interpreters came out of our own school, Hope4SouthSudan Primary! It's amazing to see how fast these students are growing in their English skills!

## Flooded with Blessings



Last month we realized the desperate need for **another well** to supply water for surrounding villages. I made mention of this need to leadership

and, by faith believing that the money would come in to cover the cost, they sent an advance almost immediately. Work began on the well right away, and it was completed on November 10<sup>th</sup>. On that same day I heard the news that the cost had already been covered by donors! What an unbelievable blessing to see God's hand in this project. Every day, this well will serve fresh, clean drinking water to about 300 tribesmen!



The H4SS Choir traveled to the town of Narus on November 15<sup>th</sup> to minister to a congregation there. It was such a blessing to us

to be able to support these boys and girls as they ministered to their family in Christ. *Pray that they'll take advantage of more ministry opportunities in future!*
