What an encouragement to witness 20+ eager volunteers, Rotary members, spouses, and children, give up their morning hours on a beautiful sunny day to bring the Coffee Oasis-Poulsbo closer to realization! It was very exciting to see how much they accomplished in a few hours...demolition, framing, foundation work, digging fence posts, and painting to give you a small glimpse...

Another huge blessing this past week was the opportunity for some of our "kids" to go to camp. Due to the amazing generosity, flexibility and support of Island Lake Camp staff and a few fundraisers, eight youth were able to have an unforgettable camp experience! We are hoping to double or triple that figure next year.



Other encouraging **blessings** (just to list a few)...

- Natalie Fell raised approximately \$3,000 for The Coffee Oasis through her participation in an Ironman Triathlon!
- Bainbridge Island Rotary gave \$5,000 towards Coffee Oasis-Poulsbo.
- Grace Church has committed \$10,000/year over the next two years to the Coffee Oasis-Poulsbo

- Yesterday, while walking to work, Angelica, manager of Coffee Oasis #2, was hit by a car! Thankfully, nothing was broken and there is no evidence of internal damage.
- Oasis Teen Shelter-Coffee Oasis Bremerton Remodel. Who would have thought that we would have to close Bremerton Coffee Oasis for over three months during the construction process? Please pray for \$25,000 still needed.
- COA (Coffee Oasis Administration Building) purchase. Who would have thought that we would still be waiting on the final closing? And the seller is getting antsy! (STOP PRESS: papers are signed, closes on Monday, July 16, 2012)
- Summer Youth Vanishings. This is a common challenge during the summer...that the youth who are so engaged in case management and job training disappear when the weather turns nice.
- The Battle for Broken Youth. Sometimes it can be almost overwhelming walking with these young people through the hurt and pain they have suffered. And yet how exciting to witness the change, healing and transformation that happens.

... an Administration Building... affectionately called the COA (Coffee Oasis Administration)! If you have ever driven around behind the CO1 (Bremerton Coffee Oasis), you have noticed, or even parked, in a large parking lot behind the building. At the far end of that lot is this nicely renovated historical building of Bremerton. It was originally built as the first telephone exchange building in Bremerton. Later the Bremerton Chamber of Commerce had it's home there. Then recently it was owned by an architectural firm.

The basement houses storage, a kitchen, a prayer room, and rooms we will use as Sunday School rooms for The Refuge. The main floor is a maze of cubicles at which you find many of our amazing staff. There is a half upper floor that serves as our conference room. Drop by sometime for a visit.

We are grateful for the generosity of Seaside Church, located adjacent to Evergreen Park about 1 mile from The Coffee Oasis, as they have allowed us to use their building for the Oasis Center, Band Shows and our weekly meeting of The Refuge, the Coffee Oasis church gathering.

And what's happening to the business? Good question! Hopefully many are getting coffee from The Coffee Oasis Drive Thru at 6th & Veneta or The Coffee Oasis Cart in the government building instead. Oasis Catering is working out of The Coffee Oasis in Port Orchard and our Coffee Roasting Company is happening in the midst of the construction behind dust barriers. Flexibility has definitely been the name of the game!

What's happening in HOPE INC?

It's not an easy task moving a youth from a life of very little guidance and structure to a place where they are ready to enter into the world of the workforce. The ideas of showing up on time, calling if you are sick, not walking out when you are frustrated, talking respectfully to your boss, being a learner and so on are somewhat foreign to many of our youth. When they want to enter into our job training program, suddenly there is too much structure too fast and the follow through becomes overwhelming...

Introducing... TAAG

The **T**een **A**rt **A**ction **G**roup at The Coffee Oasis was one of four Teen Action Groups in our county this past year. The Kitsap County Commission on Children and Youth, an advisory board to the county commissioners, spearheaded the formation of these groups for the purpose of empowering youth with higher risk of "falling between the cracks" to become productive members of our community. Through building relationships, educating and working on a project together, the students were challenged and provided opportunity to embrace increased structure in their lives, move beyond the obstacles in their lives and move beyond selfishness to serving their community. As represented by the name of The Coffee Oasis group, art was the medium chosen to draw our group together. Renaissance Alternative High School welcomed this project and Jovena Barry-Moeller and Steve Priest, teachers from Renaissance and Bremerton High School, partnered with Sheila, director of HOPE INC, to make it happen. As a final project, the group chose to create a mural by constructing clay tiles in a mosaic format to depict the

difference the hearts of youth can have in turning obstacles into fruits of productivity. The culmination of this project has been half realized. The TAAG students gave a presentation of their experiences and project to the Commission on Children and Youth the second week of June. The remaining task is to find a place for their mural to be mounted for public enjoyment. The expertise and materials are available for professional mounting. Job internships are still going strong. At this current time, there are 3 youth in Internship Pre-Requisite classes, 5 youth in the interview process and 6 youth onsite in internships. The Build-a-Bike program pictured to the right is one of 12 internships available with 12 different partnering businesses. Goodwill has also partnered with us in the Pre-Requisite training classes as they are teaching 3 out of the 7 classes. Their focus is on interviewing and job searching.
