# **Storyliving**

At Rich Olive's memorial service, many people spoke about his tireless dedication to making Story City a better place. Mark Jackson said his favorite quote from the "Book of Rich" was to "Do whatever it takes for whatever they need, with a whole lot of love and a little bit of fun." Now it's up to us to pick up the torch that Rich has laid down, working together for the sake of our community.

This summer I will gather some local leaders for an experiment in living out the story God wants to tell in Story City. I plan to bring together a wide range of 8-10 Christians from local businesses, churches, schools, and government to meet once a week for six weeks. This group experience will be the core of the final project for my Doctor of Ministry studies. We will read Scripture, pray, and share stories about where we see God at work in Story City and where we imagine God weeps for our city. We will figure out ways we can make a difference together in places and situations that are not yet what God wants them to be. My hope is that this experience of community will stoke our "holy imagination" by helping us see our city, God's mission in it, and our own roles with new eyes. What is God's dream for Story City? What part do we get to play in it? May we all dedicate ourselves to living out the story of God's mission to redeem and restore our world, beginning right here.

This month we are introducing two new series by Karen Kingsbury. Both of them continue the stories of the Baxter and Flanagan families as they meet new people and encounter new situations. Though their faith is often tested, they know that it will see them through.


The first book in the "Baxter Family Drama - Sunrise Series" is aptly titled <u>Sunrise</u>. Dayne Matthews, the oldest Baxter sibling and a Hollywood celebrity is recovering from a nasty run-in with the paparazzi. He is back in Bloomington to heal and spend time with his family and special friend, Katy Hart. As he and Katy try to figure out a future together they discover what their true priorities are and how much they are willing to sacrifice to keep them. Other titles in this series are <u>Summer</u>, <u>Someday</u>, and Sunset.

Take One is the first book in Kingbury's "Above the Line" series. Chase Ryan and Keith Ellison see the world of entertainment as a wide open mission field. They are excited and committed to producing the kind of movies that will draw people closer to God. As they face numerous obstacles and challenges, they are reminded that persecution is part of being a Christian. Can they be successful movie makers without sacrificing their faith and their families?

We also have a new historical romance by Judith Miller, More Than Words. Living in Iowa's Amana Colonies in the late 1800's, Gretchen Kohler finds herself with many concerns - a general store to run with her father, a younger brother to keep in line, and a grandmother suffering dementia. Gretchen's only means of escape is through her writing. When an "outsider" charms her into turning in some of her stories to be published, she is horrified to see how they are used. When a band of Gypsies sets the town on edge and her lifelong friend declares his intentions to marry her, Gretchen struggles to sort out her feelings and responsibilities as she plans for her future as a daughter of Amana.

On Father's Day, we gathered for worship as a congregation at Riverside Bible Camp. The renovation of the chapel and the construction of the pool are being financed by the Living Water, Living Word capital appeal, which has a \$2.5 million goal. About \$1.9 million has already been raised in pledges and gifts, which leaves \$600,000 left to go. As we experienced firsthand, the new pool is up and running, and the chapel's roof and windows have been replaced. The chapel still needs improvements to its flooring (currently bare concrete) and air conditioning.
