



# THE VOICE OF IMMANUEL

November 2015

We have just celebrated the Reformation. The realization that Martin Luther made about the current state of the church. He began that conversation with the posting of the 95 Theses, hoping to begin a conversation (debate) with the Church leaders about their beliefs and practices, calling them to examine herself. This call led many others to do the same. One of the talks given at the Theological Conference in Dallas was about The First Martyrs of the Reformation given by Dr. Hans Wiersma (who has a book coming out on the subject). He talked about the Augustinian Monks from Antwerp, Henry Voes and Johann Esch.

Henry Voes and Johann Esch were monks at the Antwerp monastery that in 1522 publically confessed Lutheran doctrine. All the monks were arrested, some escaped, the rest were interrogated. The results were that all but three recanted when faced with burning at the stake. Henry and Johann when interrogated a second time did not recant, the third ask for more time. Henry and Johann were taken to the market place in Brussels on July 1, 1523. The custom was to announce what they were convicted of before the sentence was carried out. The religious officials were worried that those who had gathered might be swayed by the Lutheran doctrine and convert as well as protest. It is said that as they burned they sang joyfully to the Lord. Upon learning of the martyrdom Luther wrote what is thought to be his first hymn, here are 5 out of the 12 verses.

*"A New Song Here Shall Be Begun"*

A new song here shall be begun  
the Lord God help our singing!  
Of what our God himself hath done,  
Praise, honor to him bringing.  
At Brussels in the Netherlands  
By two boys, martyrs youthful  
He showed the wonders of his hands,  
who he with a favor truthful  
So richly hath adorned.

The first right fitly John was named,  
So rich he in God's favor;

His brother, Henry—one unblamed,  
Whose salt lost not its savor.  
From this world they are gone away,  
The diadem they've gained;  
Honest, like God's good children, they  
For his word life disdained,  
And have become his martyrs.

Their cloister-garments off they tore,  
Took off their consecrations;  
All this the boys were ready for,  
They said Amen with patience.  
To God their Father they gave thanks  
That they would soon be rescued  
From Satan's scoffs and mumming pranks,  
With which, in falsehood masked,  
The world he so befooleth.

Then gracious God did grant to them  
To pass true priesthood's border,  
And offer up themselves to him,  
And enter Christ's own order,  
Unto the world to die outright,  
With falsehood made a schism,  
And come to heaven all pure and white,  
To monkery be the besom,  
And leave men's toys behind them.

Let them lie on for evermore—  
No refuge so is reared;  
For us, we thank our God therefore,  
His word has reappeared.  
Even at the door is summer nigh,  
The winter now is ended,  
The tender flowers come out and spy;  
His hand when once extended  
Withdraws not till he's finished.

**PARISH NURSE**

November – Cold vs Flu:

Newsletter “Yet I said to myself, ‘This is my sickness, and I must endure it.’” Jeremiah 10:19 NIV During this time of year we often wonder if the upper respiratory infection we have is a cold or the flu. Here is a chart to help determine which it is:

Cold	Symptom	Flu
Pretty rare	Fever	Usually present
Slight body aches and pains	Aches	Severe aches & pains
Uncommon	Chills	Fairly Common
Fairly mild	Fatigue	Moderate to severe
Develop over a few days	Sudden symptoms	Rapid onset of 3-6 hrs
Hacking & productive	Coughing	Dry & nonproductive
Common	Sneezing	Uncommon
Common	Stuffy Nose	Uncommon
Mild to moderate	Sore Throat	Uncommon
Mild to moderate	Chest Discomfort	Often severe
Fairly uncommon	Headache	Very common

Unlike colds, flu can lead to complications like pneumonia, especially in the old, the young, and those with serious health issues. Viruses are transmitted by contact with objects that the infected person has touched after coughing or sneezing. Germs can be transmitted 1 day before symptoms appear and up to 5 days after getting sick. Stay healthy by eating well, exercising regularly, getting plenty of rest, and practicing good hand washing. If you have a cold or the flu, cover your nose and mouth with a tissue or elbow when coughing/sneezing, avoid people while ill, wash your hands after coughing/sneezing, and avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. If you are ill stay home; don't share your germs. Treat your symptoms by hydrating yourself, getting plenty of rest, gargling to moisten a sore throat, drinking hot liquids to relieve nasal congestion, taking a steamy shower to clear nasal passages, applying hot or cold packs to congested sinuses, using an extra pillow when sleeping to relieve congestion, and avoiding travel by air. 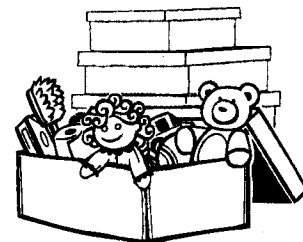

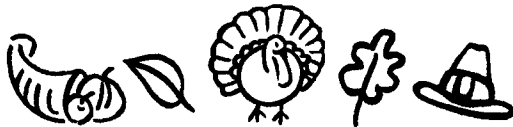

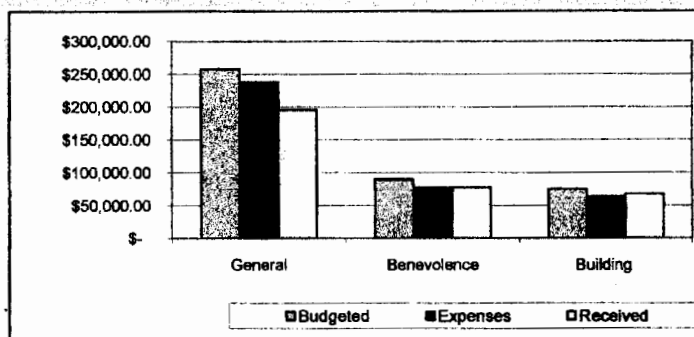
