What do these Bible verses have in common? What holds them together?

When you read through them, you see strong statements of promise and commitment by God for His people. Each student chose their own verse and then wrote an essay based on that verse. If you heard them read, you were encouraged by their statement of faith. What is your confirmation verse? If you don't have one, select one for yourself. What would you include in your essay? Try to write one. It is only 600 words – unless you choose to go farther.

It is not easy holding to the Christian faith in a world that is increasingly antagonistic toward it. The temptations to wander astray and to follow the values and morals of the world not only encircle us, but also penetrate the community of faith. What are the examples that we set? What is the strength of our commitment? Your fellow Christians and the rest of the world are watching. May we be faithful!

Throughout the ages women have been taught to be organizers, nurturers, and caretakers for others while neglecting their own needs and desires. Even today you are expected to be superwomen and excel in the roles of wife, mother, daughter, volunteer, employee, caretaker, protector, and businesswoman. Unfortunately while accomplishing these tasks, women forget the most important tasks of a healthy life – balance and self-care.

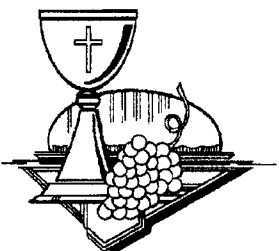
Committee Reports

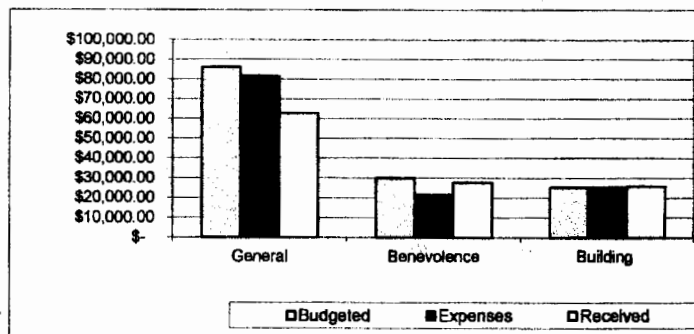
