



THE VOICE OF IMMANUEL

November 2016

We are living in very changing and challenging times. Except for political junkies, I think it is safe to say that most of us are happy that shortly, the political season will be over. Unfortunately, it will be all too brief until the campaign begins again. But we remain in a very politically charged world. People easily take offence at comments or positions that are different from their own. Sometimes people look for opportunities to make a point.

In light of the recent decision by the US Supreme Court in *Obergefell v. Hodges*, as well as other federal/state/provincial/local legal developments and societal trends across North America, NALC pastors and congregations are concerned about potential implications for their ministries. So, the NALC has put together a task force to provide advice and make suggestions to NALC congregations and pastors related to a range of congregational policy and practice topics.

We at Immanuel understand and believe that marriage is a sacred union between a man and a woman. Over the past 18 months or so, the church council has made that position clear in the *Wedding Guidelines* document which essentially is our policy statement in this regard. It says, "Therefore, no 'marriage' or 'blessing of a same-sex union' will be performed at Immanuel." That is a good place to start. The *Wedding Guidelines* also explain more fully the basis of that position by pointing to Immanuel's Constitution as well as the NALC Constitution.

Now, the NALC task force is encouraging a fuller range of statements, policies, and practices to reinforce our position. On the next page, you will find "Doctrine on Marriage and Sexuality." Our church council recommends that Immanuel adopt this statement as an appendix to our Constitution.

In faith and life, the Holy Scriptures hold the highest authority. In a congregation's organization, its constitution holds the highest authority. By including this document as an appendix, it gives it the full weight of the Constitution's authority.

Please read the statement carefully. We will be taking this up at the annual meeting on January 22, 2017. The council endorses the adoption of this appendix. It will take some time to accomplish this action. According to Article 17.02, an amendment to this constitution, shall: **a.** be approved at a legally called Congregational Meeting by a simple majority vote of those present and voting, and **b.** be ratified without change at the next annual Congregational Meeting by a two-thirds majority vote of those present and voting.

Are we protected before this amendment takes effect? I believe we are. First, we can demonstrate current policy via the *Wedding Guidelines*. Second, if it passes, we can demonstrate intent via action initiated at the congregational meeting. These actions help Immanuel to describe the rationale for the position it takes with regard to marriage and sexuality. It helps us in a litigious and argumentative world. It gives us a line of defense in case it is necessary.

But we must never become confused. Having correct policies in place is *not* the purpose of the Church. As Christians, we must begin with confession of our own sin and involvement in the confused morals of our society. In regard to sex, we confess that we have sinned in thought, word, and deed. We plead for forgiveness. And we invite into the body of Christ other sinners who are in need of forgiveness. We continue to ask the Holy Spirit to lead and guide us as we turn our backs on sin and seek to follow the way of Christ.

Doctrine on Marriage and Sexuality

Immanuel Lutheran Church of Flatville believes and confesses the “canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments as the inspired Word of God and the authoritative source and norm of its proclamation, faith and life.” (NALC Constitution, Article 2.03)

The Triune God reveals a clear, consistent word regarding marriage and sexuality in Holy Scripture. He establishes marriage as the intimate relationship of a man and a woman to be ended only in death:

So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. (Genesis 1:27)

Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh. (Genesis 2:24)

Our Lord Jesus Christ quotes these two verses when asked about divorce:

He answered, “Have you not read that he who created them from the beginning made them male and female, and said, ‘Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh’? So they are no longer two but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate.” (Matthew 19:4-6)

Furthermore, God commands that sexual relationships are for marriage alone. All forms of sexual behavior and relationships outside the marriage of one man and one woman are prohibited. The commandment, “You shall not commit adultery,” (Exodus 20:14) is primary, and Leviticus 18 records detailed, explicit prohibitions. Two of the many other Scriptural prohibitions are:

“You have heard that it was said, ‘You shall not commit adultery.’ But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart.” (Matthew 5:27-28)

Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. (1 Corinthians 6:9-10)

Article 6 of The Common Confession, the Appendix to the NALC Constitution, summarizes the Scriptural witness to God’s will for marriage and family:

We believe and confess that the marriage of male and female is an institution created and blessed by God. From marriage, God forms families to serve as the building blocks of all human civilization and community. We teach and practice that sexual activity belongs exclusively within the Biblical boundaries of a faithful marriage between one man and one woman.

Therefore in obedience to our Lord and in submission to the authority of Scripture over all matters of faith and life, Immanuel Lutheran Church strives to ensure that all of its preaching, teaching and practices are in accord with God’s will for marriage and sexuality.

PARISH NURSE

November – Organ Donation

“There is no greater love than to lay down one’s life for one’s friends.” John 15:13 NLT

How much thought have you given to how you can help others? Organ and tissue donation is one way to offer help. It can be as simple as donating a pint of blood every 6 months or as complicated as donating a kidney to a relative. Even at death you have an opportunity to share life-giving measures since thousands of people across the country wait every day for another chance at life through organ donation.

Through multiple tissue and organ donation, one donor has the potential to help from 1 to over 35 people. Some common organs that are removed include the heart, eyes, skin, bones, liver, lungs, and kidneys. The people waiting for these organs suffer from conditions like heart disease, kidney disease, cancer or accident reconstruction surgery, corneal damage, incurable lung diseases, and even curvature of the spine. A donation of bone, tissue, or organ is their only chance at a better quality of life.

Although approximately 90% of Americans say they support organ donation, waiting lists continue to grow because the availability of organs and tissue is extremely low. Only 35% of those who support donation have taken steps to do so and about a third of them do not donate because of family dissention or misunderstandings. Many times the problem is the misunderstanding that donating organs creates a cost to the donor family and prevents the option of an open casket at the funeral. Neither is true. Educating people about organ donation is an important part of the solution. If you choose to be an organ donor, discuss it with your family. Help them understand why it is important to you and how it can help others. Most all religions approve of some type of organ and tissue donation and see it as a gift to humanity.

Act now and become a donor. Talk with your family today about this important act of faith, hope, and love.

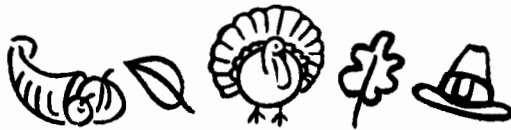

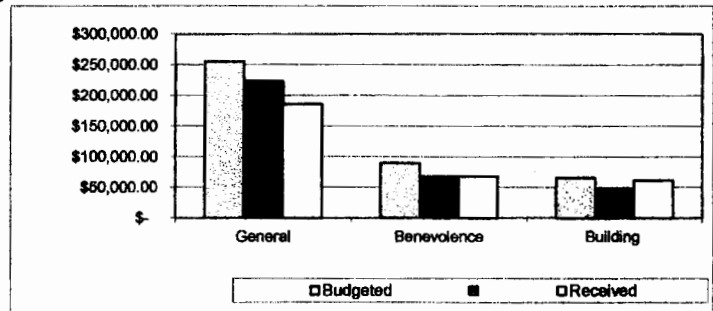

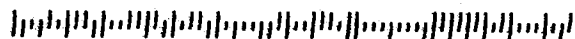
