



THE VOICE OF IMMANUEL

“Just think, you’re here not by chance but by God’s choosing. His hand formed you and made you the person you are. He compares you to no one else—you are one of a kind. You lack nothing that His grace can’t give you. He has allowed you to be here at this time in history to fulfill His special purpose for this generation.” Roy Lessin

This quote was on a card that the Women of Immanuel gave me when I arrived over three years ago. It has been sitting on my desk ever since. At a critical moment, the very start of a life of ministry, you all became the path God chose for me. You began to shape me into the role of Shepherd. Every moment spent in your lives, preaching, teaching, sharing and living all come together to mold me for the call of a Shepherd for God’s flock. Some lessons are easier to learn than others but all lessons are needed, just as much as the ones I had in Seminary. The ones you teach me require a great deal more than showing up for a class. They require a give and a take, a invitation and an acceptance, and a voice as well as an ear. These lessons are the ones acquired in a life live together. They are my most treasured lessons.

Through you God has, is and will continue to shape me for His service. As the card quotes Ecclesiastes 3:1, “To every thing there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven.” My season with you has prepared me for ministry to where ever God calls me. On one hand I grieve for the loss of a life lived together, but on the other I

use what you have given me to listen to the call that God has on my life. Without you I would not have heard him say, “Come.” And for that I thank you.

A little bit about where I am going. Western New Hope Parish is made up of 4 churches, First Lutheran Church, Philip; Our Savior's Lutheran, Long Valley; Trinity Lutheran Church, Midland; and Deep Creek Lutheran, Moenville. Philip, where the parsonage is located, is the biggest town, about 800 people. The congregations range in size from the largest 50 to the smallest at 15. The area is mostly agricultural and beef, so I am still seeing corn, soybeans with wheat, hay and sunflowers added into the mix. As well as grasslands with beef cattle grazing. Life out there is definitely rural and quiet, yet has the same kind of beauty that life in Flatville has. So along with football games there are roping events. And I am about 1 ½ hours from Mt Rushmore.

In closing, just as I mentioned this past Sunday, Revelation 22:17 has been on my mind throughout this process. “The Spirit and the Bride say, “Come.” And let the one who hears say, “Come.” And let the one who is thirsty come; let the one who desires take the water of life without price.” As well as the Great Commission which tells us to “Go and make disciples....” I thank you for saying to me “Come” and as I go, I pray that the Lord continues to bless all of us as we continue to walk this life as a Christian serving and living out whatever God has called us to.

PARISH NURSE

October – Dental:

“The fathers have eaten sour grapes and the children’s teeth are set on edge.” Jeremiah 31:29 NIV

We all want to prevent heart disease. The usual recommendations for prevention of cardiovascular disease are to lose weight if overweight, eat a healthy variety of foods, exercise regularly, and don’t smoke. There is one more that may surprise you. Research shows a correlation between gum disease and heart disease because infection can travel from the mouth to the heart muscle. Who would have thought that brushing your teeth and flossing regularly might help prevent heart disease?

Some people are genetically more prone to gum disease, but everyone can be vigilant in keeping their mouths healthy. Healthy gums are pink, firm and elastic. Conditions of the mouth that may be related to heart disease include:

- **Gingivitis:** bacteria builds up around gaps between gums and teeth and causes mild symptoms of redness, swelling and sometimes bleeding.
- **Periodontitis:** advanced gum disease where infection goes deeper. Toxins from bacteria are released that cause pockets to form between teeth and gums. Eventually this can cause damage to the bone that supports teeth. Gums recede from the teeth and bleeding is common.
- **Cavities, abscesses, missing teeth:** mouth problems that can lead to inflammation and possible heart disease.

Some medications can cause dry mouth that can lead to gum disease. Illnesses like diabetes or arthritis can also affect the immune system causing gum problems. These need to be discussed with the doctor and dentist to find a solution.

Prevention is the key. Brush your teeth twice a day and floss at least once a day. Brushing should be in a circular motion. Back and forth brushing can actually cause damage to the gums. Flossing also needs to be done properly to be effective. At your

next visit check with the hygienist or dentist to be sure that your technique is correct. Visits for cleaning and checkups should be at least every six months. Anyone with existing gum problems will need more frequent cleanings. Caring for your teeth and gums takes little time when you consider the benefit it may give your heart.

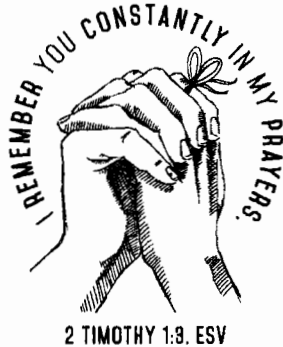

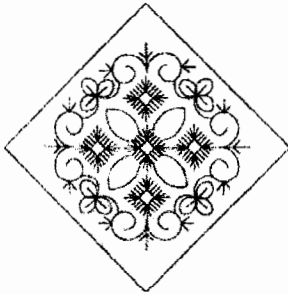
THANK YOU

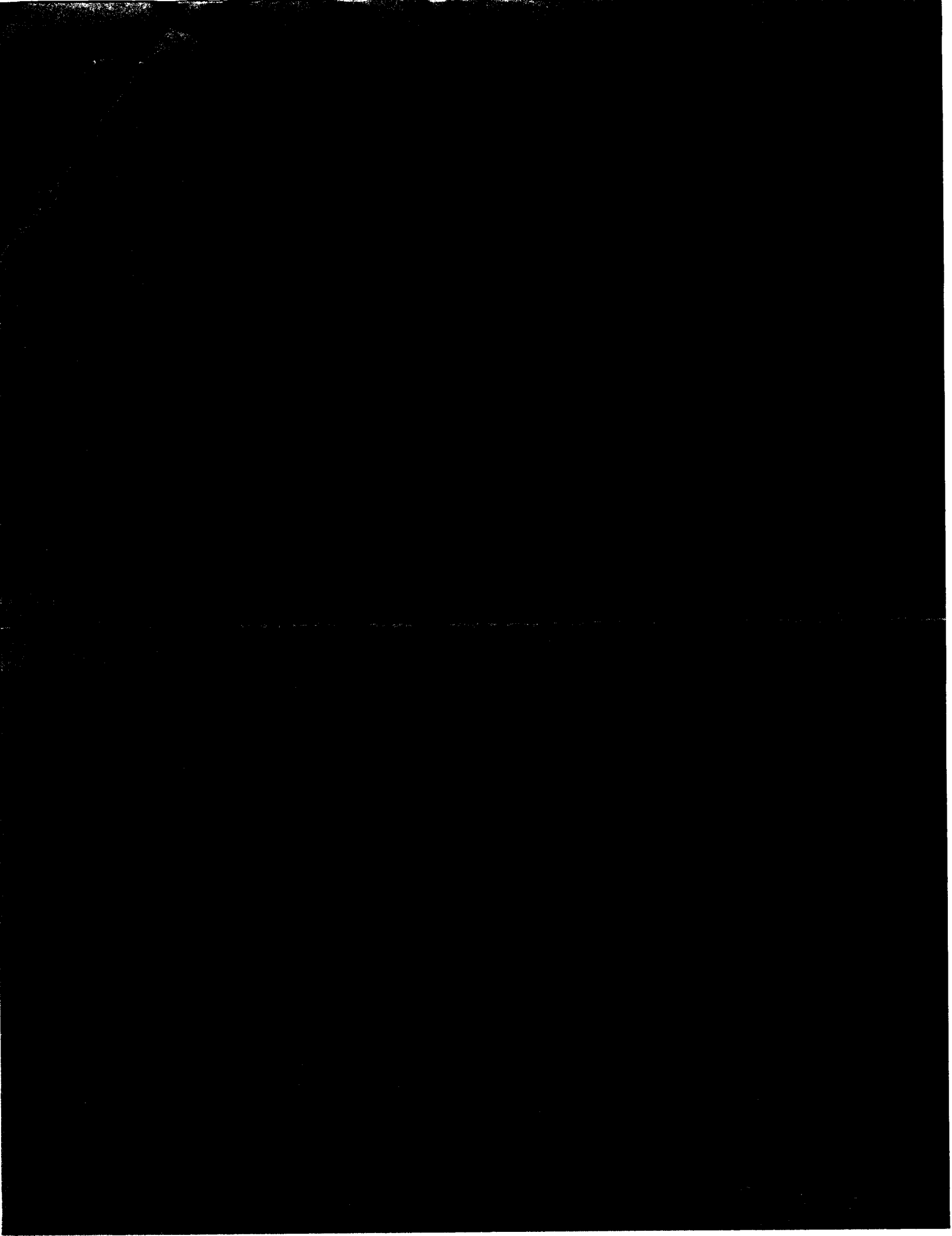

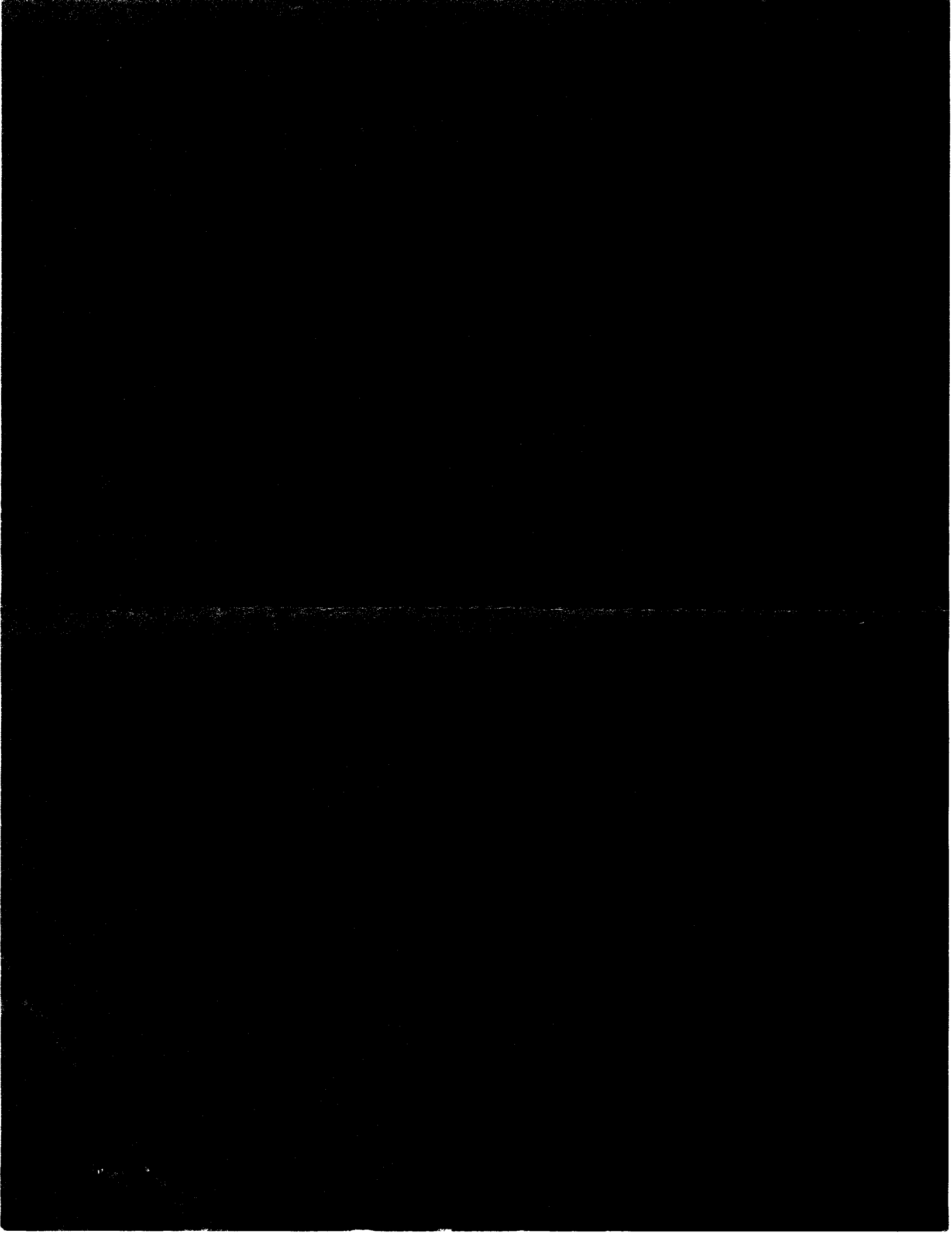

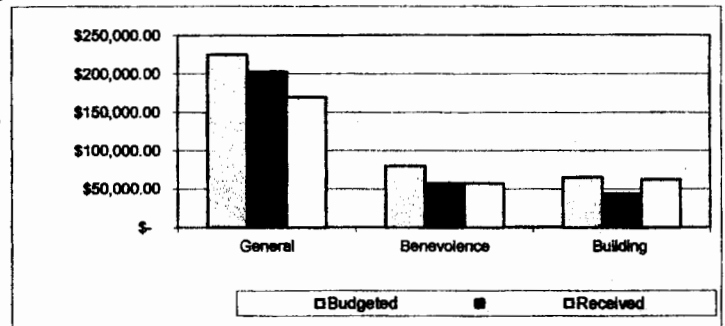
