An African proverb says, “You may not know where you are going, but you must know where you came from!” Why is that so important? Without an understanding of our past we are set adrift. As America seeks to forget its past, we lose track of the values that we hold dear. As Christians, when we lose sight of our past we are *tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine*. (Ephesians 4:14)

October 31 marks the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther nailing 95 Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. That was the spark that ignited debate which eventually led to the formation of the Lutheran Church. There are many aspects to the events of those decades. Some are worth celebrating. Some require confession. It is important to know from where we came so that we can hold to those doctrines and values that make up the Church.

Many educational opportunities are being presented at Immanuel this fall. Our youth will be learning about these events. Here are just a few for the adults: “In the Luther Household – A Bible Study on the Lutheran Understanding of Marriage and Family,” a video series “A Man Named Martin – The Man, The Moment, The Movement,” and the adult Sunday School “A Short Life of Martin Luther.” We hope that you will take advantage of them.

OK. So we’ll learn a lot of stuff. So what? Will that effect our life of faith? It can. When we know our past, we better understand our present and have an idea of the trajectory of our future. How do we put this into practice? This takes place within the home. This is where faith is taught and practiced. Luther wrote *The Small Catechism* so that parents would have a handy resource outlining

the fundamentals of the faith as they taught their children.

Here is a resource to continue that effort. Holy Families! is an initiative of the North American Lutheran Church in honor of the 500th anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation (1517 AD to 2017 AD). This special initiative will include a number of Lutheran discipleship resources for families and congregations. Web Resources are available on the Holy Families Website (holyfamilytime.com). It includes:

Luther understood well that we are “simultaneously saint and sinner.” We are not getting better day by day on our way to perfection. We seek to walk ever closer with our Lord. We continue to do battle with sin and to live lives more in line with what God wants. However, God’s grace makes us a saint, even in our real lives. In *The Small Catechism* Luther asks: What does Baptism mean for daily living? It means that our sinful self, with all its evil deeds and desires, should be drowned through daily repentance; and that day after day a new self should arise to live with God in righteousness and purity forever. May these resources help us as we share the faith with those around us!

PARISH NURSE

September - Hearing:

“Ears to hear and eyes to see – both are gifts from the Lord.” Proverbs 20:12 NLT

We’ve all said it, “He hears when he wants to hear.” Sometimes people seem to hear and understand without difficulty and other times they seem not to hear anything. We often assume that it is selective listening but it is usually more than just ‘not listening.’

When hearing is lost, a great deal of energy and time goes into trying to understand what is being said. A person can be totally exhausted by the end of a day spent struggling to hear. Hearing aids help make conversation better – not perfect. Even with hearing aids some things will be missed. Most people with good hearing miss things but fill in the blanks. To ensure that one who doesn’t hear well, will hear what you say:

- Face them so they can see your lips and your facial expression – be sure the light is not behind you as your face will be in the shadows
- Try to eliminate as much extraneous noise as possible
- Don’t shout – use a normal voice
- Try not to drop your voice at the end of a sentence
- Enunciate your words without exaggerating them
- Remember that speaking rapidly makes you difficult to understand so slow down
- When you are not being understood, try rephrasing what you are saying. It often gives more clues to meaning.
- Don’t say “Never mind; it wasn’t important.” The person might feel that they are not important enough for you to repeat the statement.

Hearing impairment is complex. Get a person’s attention first and you have a better chance of being understood. Be patient and keep trying. If the hearing impaired appear aloof or disinterested, they may not be aware of your presence or be able to understand what you are saying. Don’t assume that hearing aids will help since adjusting to them can be difficult. This especially impacts older people who

have lived in a very quiet world for a long time and suddenly experience painful, loud, and disruptive noise. Time and patience are needed to make the adjustment as the person must gradually increase both the wearing time and noise level before being comfortable with the aids.

If you are having difficulty hearing, ask for help. God is good and has provided many advances to help the hearing impaired. There may be no need to be isolated by hearing loss. Check with your doctor.

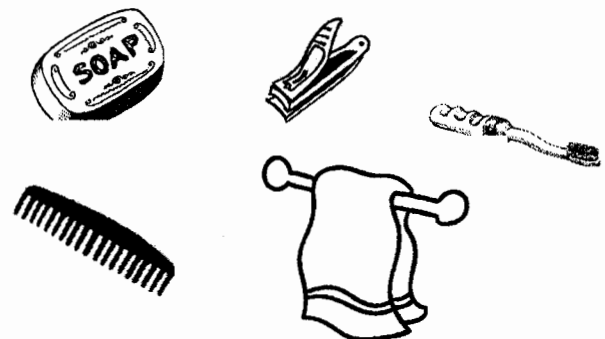
LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

APPLE SNACKS



These healthy chips make a yummy back-to-school snack.

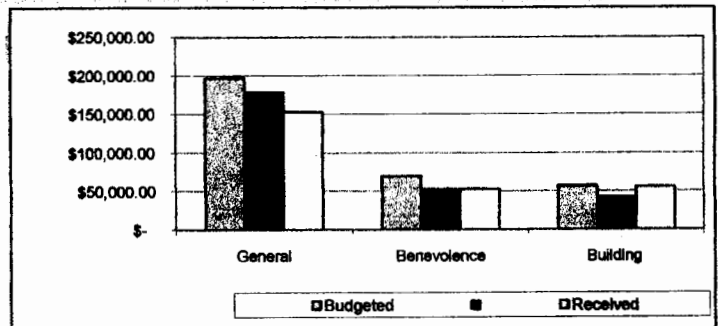

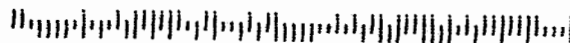
