



THE VOICE OF IMMANUEL

June/July 2018

Recently the Great Rivers Mission District was on retreat at the Chiara Center just outside of Springfield, IL, on the northeast corner. Their mission statement states: "Grounded in the spirit of Saints Francis and Clare of Assisi, Chiara Center offers a peaceful, inspirational setting for individuals, couples, and groups who seek Christ's healing presence."

It is the mother house for the Hospital Sisters of St. Francis. It is on the grounds of where the Sisters operated a tuberculosis sanatorium. At the time, the best treatment was fresh air and sunshine, so it is located at the highest elevation in the area. The building and grounds are simply spectacular.

These are individuals who dedicated their entire lives to the Church, to the sick who were in need, and to each other. In the museum, a display recorded their vows:

"I vow to Almighty God, before those here present to live forever in poverty, obedience, and celibate chastity, according to the Rule and Constitutions of the Hospital Sisters of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis.

I place myself completely at the disposition of this community for the service of the Church."

When they vowed to place themselves completely at the disposition of the community, they lived it in a significant way. On "sending day," they would come to dinner. Opening the drawer at their tables, they would find a letter informing and instructing them where they would be stationed throughout the Midwest, but also around the world. If it sounds like orders in the military, it was.

Where do we find such selfless dedication to the Church today? Why would someone place themselves at the disposal of someone else? What would motivate such a life? The love of God can do that. When a person captures a vision of the breadth of God's love and the depth of human need, then a person will sacrifice all and yet not see it as a sacrifice. It is

willingly giving to the One who gave all -- Jesus Christ.

As I strolled the grounds, I came upon the first cemetery where the sisters were laid to rest in anticipation of the resurrection. The simplicity of the markers and the orientation to the Cross is breathtaking. Their commitment to Christ and to each other means that their burial plot was based simply on who died next.



This is a common practice in orders in the Church, but with few exceptions it is uncommon in the world. It draws attention to the fact that God sees us as members of the Body of Christ. From God's perspective, our surname is of no consequence. Born in the waters of Baptism, we are adopted into the family of God.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body and all were made to drink of one Spirit. 1 Corinthians

12:12-13

DON'T WORRY ABOUT NOTHIN'

Matt. 6:5-27 Who of you by worry can add a single hour to his life? Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself.

A gospel song entitled, "Don't Worry About Nothin'" has the following refrain:

Don't worry about nothin'
Pray about everything.
Don't worry about nothin'
Leave it to the King.

"Worrying is like a rocking chair, it gives you something to do, but it doesn't get you anywhere." (author unknown) It's hard to "let go and let God" but what peace of mind we have when we can achieve that state for even a few minutes. Constant worry can increase our blood pressure, and diminish our breathing. The constant state of "fight or flight" wears down our body's natural defenses making us more prone to illness and disease. How do we NOT worry? It's a choice. The choice to believe God is in control.

Tip of the month/Action Steps

- Pray for those on the prayer list, that they will experience peace and know that God is in control.
- Send a card to someone on the prayer list; call one person and tell them you are thinking/praying for him/her.
- Pray for yourself to grow in trust in the Lord.
- Give your problem(s) to the Lord daily. If you take them back, stop, and hand them off again.
- Make a conscious effort to take 5 deep breaths at least once an hour throughout your waking

hours. Breathe slow . . . and deep . . . This will tell your body to turn off the "fight or flight" switch.

OSTFRIESIAN HERITAGE SOCIETY

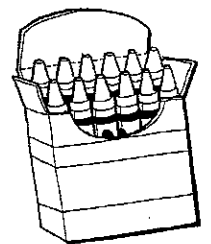
The Ostfriesian Heritage Society will be meeting on Sunday, June 17th, and Sunday, July 15th, in Diers Hall, at 1:00 p.m.

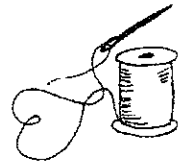

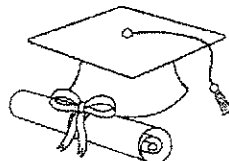

- 8:00 a.m. - Those north of the church will meet at Evan Huls' corner. He will leave promptly at 8:00 for church.

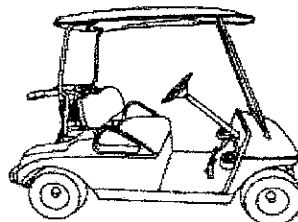

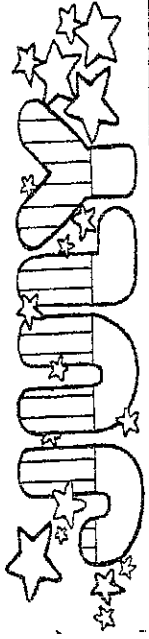

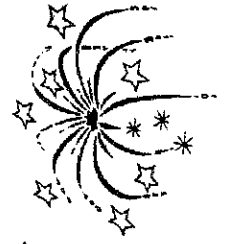
