## QUILTING NEWS FROM A "DISASTER RESPONSE" PERSPECTIVE

Many of the Lutheran churches have a quilting or sewing group that makes quilts and kits. A lot of those items are sent to Lutheran World Relief, which does wonderful work helping our brothers & sisters in need overseas. If your sewing group is like mine, we receive many donations of fabric from all over. In sewing quilts for LWR, there are certain patterns that they cannot accept. For example, LWR does not take anything with religious symbols, patriotic & military signs (including camouflage), and some holidays. What to do with this fabric?

The answer is disaster response quilts! The **NALC** Disaster Response Task Force was formed to help individuals & families by providing assistance when disaster strikes. The focus is in areas in the United States. A warehouse in Caldwell, Ohio has been obtained to store supplies before they are dispersed. This is where quilts (and health kits & more) come in! The Task

Force can use all kinds of quilts & blankets made with any printed fabric including fabric printed with religious, patriotic & military symbols! The Task Force also welcomes any size auilt or blanket—it does not have to be the standard 80" x 60" that LWR requests. For example, a lady at our church likes to sew baby blankets and lap robes. We send these to the Disaster Warehouse as well as other items. Some churches split their donations between the warehouse and Lutheran World Relief.

So spread the word!
There is a use for that patriotic fabric or material with angels and nativity scenes on it! For more information about the Disaster Task Force & the warehouse in Caldwell, contact:

In the 2015 Convocation Staff Reports, Rev. Dr. Gemechis Buba, the assistant to the Bishop for Missions, wrote "The NALC Mission Office has a primary focus of mobilizina congregations, leaders, and Mission Districts for mission." We as the Women of the NALC can help in this endeavor as we have been MISSION DRIVEN throughout the years.

As part of our duties as members of your WNALC Mission Support Team we want to highlight mission opportunities as they arise for you to consider supporting.

Robbie Conley and I, both members of the Mission Support Team, just returned from an India Mission trip with United Evangelical

some of those needs
will follow.

One of the greatest needs of UEM is for an industrial washer and dryer for the New Life Children's Home (NLCH) in Bangalore. This Home houses children with single parents, some who have been abandoned, and more children in the most difficult circumstances, where the parents can neither afford good food and necessities nor education for them. Currently all laundry in the NLCH is done by hand, soaking, beating, scrubbing,

textiles. After rinsing, the clothes are formed in a ball and twisted by hand to extract water. The entire process often occupies an entire day of hard work, plus drying and ironing. Given the increasing load of laundry and high water consumption, UEM seeks our help in acquiring on premise commercial laundry equipment, including washer extractors and tumble dryers which would result in time and water savings and be cost effective in the long run. The total cost would be \$ 11,115. Please prayerfully consider contributing

toward this much needed purchase.

You may want to share these needs with your congregation, your Mission District, or with other WNALC groups in your area. We seem to limit ourselves when we only look at what has been possible for us in the past.

#### **ITEMS NEEDED BY UNITED EVANGELICAL MISSIONS**

Description	#	Amount in USD	Comments
Uniform for all our children ( shirt and trousers for boys Shirt and skirt for girls)	700	\$8,077 11.54 ea	We desire that our children be dressed in uniform when they attend their classes conducted by UEM. Most of the children come in torn, mended, worn out clothes. A supply of uniform set will certainly boost their confidence.
Shoes	700	\$4,846 6.92 ea	Most of our children do not have footwear. Providing black shoes would not only assist them in meeting their footwear need but also help meet their school requirement as most of the schools in India have black shoes as a part of the uniform list
School supplies	700	\$3,769 5.38 ea	Educational supplies are a dire need for these children who are deprived of even the simplest of the school needs such as bags, note books, pens, pencils, etc
Computers (Desktop + UPS + All in 1 Printer)	7	\$4,222 603.14 ea	Most of our projects are located in the poorest of the poor communities, which also means that they lack in the IT infrastructure. Some of the locations are in such remote areas that the location coordinator has to travel 10-15 miles to access email, internet, etc. Having a computer at each of the project location would certainly be a blessing and enable us to work at a faster pace.
Mini Projector with screen and stand	10	\$1,723 172.30 ea	We are in need of a projector at our project locations in order to screen Bible stories, movies, action songs and even their academic lessons during the study time.
Water purifier	5	\$1,077 215.40 ea	Some of the project locations have serious concerns with water borne diseases. It is critical that we have water purifiers to provide clean drinking water to our children, thus safeguarding their health.
Floor mats	100	\$846 8.46 ea	The children usually sit on cement floor which is very inconvenient affecting their health. Children would feel much better sitting on the floor mats.
White board with stand	12	\$462 38.50 ea	White board would certainly aid in teaching children for their studies. Especially math problems &science diagrams
Steel Almirah	2	\$369 184.50 ea	Steel cupboard to store all the important documents, files and other valuables. Urgent need at Agra and KGF projects
Water cooler	5	\$769 153.80 ea	Projects like Agra, Cuttack, Markapur, Pappakoil and Kallar have extreme weather conditions and during summer the temperature soar very high and lot of people suffer from sun stroke. Serving children cool water would be soothing and satisfying.
Filing cabinets for children's records	3	\$346 115.33 ea	Ambur project needs filing cabinets for children's letters and record maintenance.
Portable PA system	12	\$1,809 150.75 ea	For programs conducted at projects, we would require a portable PA system which includes a mike and speaker to be able to address smaller group of audience (apx 100)
Vessels (big & small vessels at kitchen)	5	\$615 123.00 ea	Currently, most of the cooking vessels at the kitchens have worn out and need immediate replacement
