

CONECT[ion]

a relationship in which a person, thing, or idea is linked or associated with something else

- [] When we start something <u>new</u> we rarely know what we're <u>doing</u>.
- [] We are <u>experts</u> with other peoples' children/students, but with our own we are <u>rookies!</u>
- [] Our hearts are hardwired for <u>relationship</u>.
- [] Our lives are hardwired for struggle.

[dis]**CONECT**[ed]

The Story of David and Absalom is full of humanity and disconnection without <u>reconciliation</u>.

- [] Must not see the king
 - But the king said, "He must go to his own house; he must not see my face." So Absalom went to his own house and did not see the face of the king.

 2 Samuel 14:24
- [] Conspiracy
 - Absalom behaved in this way toward all the Israelites who came to the king asking for justice, and so he stole the hearts of the people of Israel.
