DAY ONE:

read **ROMANS 2:14-16**

When you think about the "law" what immediately comes to your mind? Is your first thought that the law is something you want to obey or do you view it as something you want to break? This passage talks about the nature of our hearts and how we respond to the law. Take time to think about how you respond to the principles and teachings that are in God's Word. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to help you determine what areas that you struggle with and what is underneath your struggle.

DAY TWO:

read **PSALMS 19:1-6**

This passage reminds us that nothing happens without God. Days cannot come and go without Him. The same goes for us. We cannot do anything without Him. Have you had times in your life when you felt that nothing you could do was right or the things that you tried to do failed miserably? What did you do? Consider the fact that we cannot breathe without our Creator. Challenge yourself to pray about the things in your life that you try to do without God. Maybe it's teaching and training your children or maybe it's doing your job well. Whatever it is that you try to leave God out of, challenge yourself to take it to Him in prayer and allow the Holy Spirit to direct you.

DAY THREE:

read **PSALM 8**

This scripture teaches us that God's greatness can be seen in all the world. In what ways do you notice God's greatness? He has put things into perfect order. Take some time this week to appreciate all the things that God has put into place. God hears our praises. *Read Psalm 22:3.*

DAY FOUR:

read **ROMANS 1:16-20**

Deeply think about verse 20 for a moment. Even though God has made it plain to see, some people still have the tendency to overlook that unless a person is "...put right with God through faith... they will not live." (vs 17) What does that really mean? Read verses 18-20 again. How does the reality that God is the beginning of all things change the perspective of right and wrong?

DAY FIVE:

read **PSALMS 14:1-5**

This passage tells us that God is looking down from heaven to see if there is anyone who is worshipping Him. The passage ends with "...for God is with those who obey Him." When you think of obedience, what comes to mind? Are your thoughts similar to those you have about "law"? God is looking for people who want to be with Him. He desires to spend time with us. Take some time to worship Him and spend time thanking Him for all that He has created.
