PROTECTION AGAINST MISSING THE POINT OF A PASSAGE

A blinding flash of the obvious: A lot of people misinterpret the Bible.

Keep reminding them of these things. Good Rules - Hermeneutics

MISS - "How do I understand or feel about the passage?"

HIT - "What was the author trying to say?"

Understanding Literature – Genre

MISS - "The Bible is a book."

HIT - "The Bible is a tool to tell a story."

PRINCIPLES OF DISCERNMENT

How to question Bible teachers

- 1. Who published, endorsed, and wrote the forward?
- 2. What's the theological background of the author?
 - a. Bias & background
 - b. Agenda and motivation

3. What's the strength of argument?

Now these Jews were more noble than those in Thessalonica; they received the word with all eagerness, xexamining the Scriptures daily to see if these things were so. ¹² Many of them therefore believed, with not a few Greek women of high standing as well as men. Acts 17:11-12 ESV

- a. Do they make it fit?
 - i. Scripture, history of church, logical, is to real to life?
 - ii. Logic and reason "That doesn't make sense."
 - iii. Is it in line with a high view of the scripture?
- b. Do they use good rules of interpretation?
- c. Do they make arguments or attack?

4. What are the best counter arguments?

The first to present his case seems right, till another comes forward and questions him.

Proverbs 18:17

5. What's the testimony of the author's life?

"The teachers of the law and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat. ³ So you must obey them and do everything they tell you. But do not do what they do, for they do not practice what they preach."

Matthew 23:2-3

6. What's the testimony of the author's teaching?

...shepherds who feed only themselves. They are clouds without rain, blown along by the wind; autumn trees, without fruit and uprooted — twice dead.

Jude 1:12

7. What's my own bias, background and spiritual condition?

Who is wise and understanding among you? By his good conduct let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom. ¹⁴ But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. ¹⁵ This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. ¹⁶ For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice. ¹⁷ But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere. ¹⁸ And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.

James 3:13-18 ESV
