WHAT'S UNIQUE ABOUT THE BOOK OF JAMES?

It's unique in how it relates to <u>Jesus'</u> teaching in the <u>Sermon</u> on the <u>Mount</u>.

WHAT'S JAMES ALL ABOUT?

The central theme is about being perfect.

This is NOT perfection that is a state of static completeness in which all the answers are correct.

Rather it IS the perfection of being in harmony, having your inner life and your outer behavior, words, attitudes in sync. NOT being conflicted or torn in two.

Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds,

³ for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness.

⁴ And let steadfastness have its full effect, (perfect work) that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.

⁵ If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him. ⁶ But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed by the wind. ⁷ For that person must not suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord;

⁸ he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways.

James 1:2-8 (ESV)

Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves.

Do what it says. ²³ Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like a man who looks at his face in a mirror ²⁴ and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. ²⁵ But the man who looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues to do this, not forgetting what he has heard, but doing it—he will be blessed in what he does.

James 1:22-25

A LOOK IN THE MIRROR

I'm conflicted because I have a foot in two worlds.

I'm angry because I'm conflicted.

I'm lonely because I'm selfish.

I'm sinful because God is NOT my satisfaction.

I'm <u>confused</u> because I look to everything but God for <u>wisdom</u>.

I'm unstable because of the things I say.

I'm hypocritical because what I say doesn't match what I do.
