

Whether you've read the Book of James 20 times or this is your first time, be encouraged to look at it with fresh eyes and an open heart.

READ and **MEDITATE** on James 3 this week using these study methods:

PRONOUNCE IT

READ a verse over and over, emphasizing different words. Then write down your thoughts.

PICTURE IT

PUT yourself in the story, thinking through each person who is present. What do you see, feel, hear, taste, and smell?

PARAPHRASE IT

PUT it into your own words. **SEARCH** your heart to see how the passage may apply to you, and talk to God about it.

PROBE IT (using the **S.P.A.G.E.P.E.T.S.** acronym):

- **S** Is there a truth to believe?
- **P** Is there a promise to claim?
- **A** *Is there an attitude to change?*
- **c** Is there a command to obey?
- **I** Is there an example to follow?
- **P** Is there prayer to pray?
- Is there an error to avoid?
- **T** Is there a truth to believe?
- **S** Is there something for which to praise God?

PERSONALIZE IT & PRAY IT

PUT your name in the place of nouns/pronouns used in the scripture. Instead of *our* Father say *my* Father. Instead of the word *us*, use the word *me* or insert your name. Then pray the text back to God aloud as an act of worship. **PRAISE** Him for the truths He's sharing with you.

■ ¶ What desires are at war within you? Do you want to be a friend of the world or a friend of God? Can't we be friends with both?

READ/MEDITATE:

No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will stand by and be devoted to the one and despise and be against the other. You cannot serve God and mammon (deceitful riches, money, possessions, or whatever is trusted in).

Matthew 6:24 AB

- 2 READ James 4:4 a few times using the PRONOUNCE IT method. Why do you think James repeats this point? What are we called to do as an act of obedience? READ James 4:7-10. Also take time and read Psalm 51. Re-read verses 16 and 17. What does God desire of us? What step does this require you to take?
- Peter replied, "Each of you must repent of your sins and turn to God, and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. This promise is to you, and to your children, and even to the Gentiles—all who have been called by the Lord our God."

 Acts 2:38-39 NLT

Two commands are given to believers: *To repent and be baptized. Have you repented (turned from the world)? Have you been baptized?* **SPLASH 2012** (*JW's annual river baptism*) will be held at **Riverview Park Sunday, July 29** @ **10:30 am**. Be baptized as an act of faith in obedience to God. 4 What next steps do you need to take to live out your faith? According to the graphic below, grow the middle part through serving, sharing, and giving your time, talents and treasure. Everything you have is already God's! So make a choice and take a step to honor Him with it.
