Also a dispute arose among them as to which of them was considered to be greatest. <sup>25</sup> Jesus said to them, "The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those who exercise authority over them call themselves Benefactors. <sup>26</sup> But you are not to be like that. Instead, the greatest among you should be like the youngest, and the one who rules like the one who serves. <sup>27</sup> For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Rehoboam went to Shechem, for all the Israelites had gone there to make him king... the whole assembly of Israel went to Rehoboam and said to him: <sup>4</sup> "Your father put a heavy yoke on us, but now lighten the harsh labor and the heavy yoke he put on us, and we will serve you."

<sup>8</sup> But Rehoboam rejected the advice the elders gave him and consulted the young men who had grown up with him and were serving him.
<sup>9</sup> He asked them, "What is your advice?"

<sup>13</sup>The king answered the people harshly. Rejecting the advice given him by the elders, <sup>14</sup> he followed the advice of the young men and said, "My father made your yoke heavy; I will make it even heavier. My father scourged you with whips; I will scourge you with scorpions."

<sup>16</sup>When all Israel saw that the king refused to listen to them, they answered the king: "What share do we have in David, what part in Jesse's son?
To your tents, O Israel! Look after your own house, O David!"
So the Israelites went home.
