# How Did Jesus Handle Rejection?

### Home is where we want to shine

Jesus left there and went to His hometown, accompanied by His disciples. <sup>2</sup> When the Sabbath came, He began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard Him were amazed. *Mark 6:1-2a* 

## Home is where <u>rejection</u> hurts the <u>most</u>

"Where did this man get these things?" they asked. "What's this wisdom that has been given Him, that He even does miracles! <sup>3</sup> Isn't this the carpenter? Isn't this Mary's son and the brother of James, Joseph, Judas and Simon? Aren't His sisters here with us?" And they took offense at Him.

## The wisdom and maturity of Jesus

Jesus said to them, "Only in his hometown, among his relatives and in his own house is a prophet without honor." <sup>5</sup> He could not do any miracles there, except lay His hands on a few sick people and heal them. <sup>6</sup> And He was amazed at their lack of faith.

Mark 6:4-6a

- 1. Admit it hurts
- 2. Tell it to someone safe
- 3. Find community with others who have hurt
- 4. Don't embrace resentment
- 5. Bring all the healing you can
- 6. Hear the voice of God

At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. <sup>10</sup> Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, He saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on Him like a dove. <sup>11</sup> And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with You I am well pleased." <sup>12</sup> At once the Spirit sent Him out... *Mark 1:9-12* 

#### 7. Keep <u>listening</u>

Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where He prayed.
