Christa is our co-head deaconess, wedding liaison, and an occupational therapist for KHN. **Jerry Taylor**, our minister of worship and music, is the organist/choir director for today's service.

About the Music: As we gather for worship a new handbell composition is played that combines the spiritual *Swing Low, Sweet Chariot* and *Jacob's Ladder*. It was composed by Hart Morris, who is a church musician in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Alleluia! Sing to Jesus (Hymn No. 167) is a resurrection hymn accompanied today by Houston composer, Linda McKecknie's score for brass, handbells, organ, choir and congregation.

Gloria In Excelsis is a setting of this very popular text by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart.

Surely He Hath Borne Our Grievs is from George Handel's "Messiah". It is found in part two which is not sung as often as the Christmas section. Many believe the accompaniment is the sound of the cross being drug up Calvary's mountain. The text is from Isaiah 53, verses 4 and 5.

In Death's Dark Grasp the Savior Lay is an old German hymn that speaks of the crucifixion and the resurrection and was the basis of an organ chorale prelude by J.S. Bach. Coupled with this short piece is the **Fanfare** by Nicolas Lemmons, a composer from Belgium who wrote the first manuscript on method of organ playing that is still used today.

Our Church History in 1973

This year we are celebrating our church's 50th anniversary. This page each week will continue to honor the events and people in our past history. Our focus this week is on 1973.

In the US, 1973 saw the Vietnam War come to an end with the Paris Peace Accords in January and soldiers started to come home, the first cellular phone hit the market, the World Trade Center in New York was completed, and the Sears Tower in Chicago became the world's tallest building. The U.S. dominated space news with the launch of Skylab, Mariner 10 to Mercury, and Pioneer 10 sent back the first pictures of Jupiter. On the political front, Richard Nixon was inaugurated to his second term as president, but the Watergate Scandal, with its ever-increasing revelations of top government officials' involvement and the missing minutes in the Nixon's tapes, tarnished whatever he tried to accomplish. Calls for Nixon's impeachment began to surface when under presidential order the special prosecutor in the Watergate investigation was fired.

In the church, Don Bostian was in his second year as the senior pastor and helped the church grow with many baptisms that year. Frank Davis was the part-time custodian of the church, and the church offset his work by asking families to spend a Sunday morning cleaning the big areas.

Of great concern to the congregation was the debt incurred during the recent construction of both the church and school. To increase giving, a stewardship drive was started in the new year and continued until March 10. Members were visited by the Development Committee to gather ideas, share concerns, and to share a brochure that explained the giving plan. The congregation voted to borrow money (\$5000 each month) to cover the deficit but not to exceed \$30,000. Uppermost in the leadership's mind was to move as quickly as possible to Phase 2 of the master plan for the church: the wrap-around rooms for Sabbath School departments and the Fellowship Hall and kitchen on the east side of the church.

Another change in finances that caused some frustration was the recommendation from the General Conference that all SDA churches abandon the "Temple Plan" to fund tuition subsidy. Previously parents could pay through the church for their children's education and receive a tax deduction but in a recent ruling the IRS said that was not legal. The new plan was for parents to pay 10 monthly payments for tuition which was based upon the grade of their children: \$450 for grades 1-6, \$700 for grades 7-8, \$1000 for grades 9-12. The church's subsidy dropped from \$127.5 thousand to just \$45,000 when the tuition no longer came through the church books.

Spring plans for an *It Is Written* public meeting had to be postponed until the fall due to unexpected surgery for IIW speaker, George Vandeman. Instead, an Easter "Week of Prayer" was given with nightly meetings. The speakers were Winton Beaven, Al Brendel and Don Bostian.

The very first Pictorial Directory for our church came out in July with the expectation that it would help members in the growing church to know each other better. Around the new church were lots of projects for church workbees. For several Sundays in April, corresponding to Earth Day, members did projects inside the church and landscaped and seeded the berm around the new parking lot on the south side of the church. By May, Ted Shull, no longer a baker at KMC, but head of the grounds department, was personally calling for people to help mow the lawns around the church. To fellowship together, socials were planned: a St. Patrick's Day picnic, though dampened by weather, still had 65 people attend and a family camp weekend for the entire church was held June 1-3 at Camp Mohaven.

Between 1972 -1974, there were no church newsletters. Information for these articles was gleaned from conversations with many members of our congregation and from announcements in the church bulletins and pastoral letters sent out that year. Your memories, which could be lost facts, are most appreciated and welcome!
