Worship Notes:

Participants: Ron Halvorsen, Jr., our new Ohio Conference President, will present today's sermon. **Elliot Smith**, our pastor for young adults, the internship program and FreshBread, hosts today's worship and presents the Children's Story. **Lily Gan Lee**, who came to teach nutrition at Kettering College, joined our church in 1975, reads today's Scripture Lesson. **Michael Brendel**, who was baptized in this church in 1975, is currently Vice-President for Clinical and Outpatient Services for Kettering Health Network, presents the Prayers of the People. **Jerry Taylor**, our minister of worship and music, is the organist/choir director for today's service.

About the Music: As we gather for worship we hear Vitali's *Chaconne* played by **Elizabeth Wareham**, a sophomore music/pre-med major at the College Conservatory of Music in Cincinnati. A "chaconne" is a type of musical composition popular in the baroque era when it was much used as a vehicle for variations on a repeated short harmonic progression, often involving a fairly short repetitive bass-line (ground bass) which offered a compositional outline for variation, decoration, figuration and melodic invention. In this it closely resembles the passacaglia. Jascha Heifetz, generally considered the finest violinist of all time, played this piece with organ at his United States debut recital in 1920.

Praise, My Soul, the King of Heaven (Hymn No. 4) is a paraphrase of Psalm 103 by John Lyte, a Scottish pastor. The tune, *Lauda Anima,* (Latin for Praise, My Soul) was composed by Sir John Goss, the organist/choirmaster at St. Paul's Cathedral in London for 34 years.

And the Father Will Dance is taken from Zephaniah 3:14,17 and Psalm 34:2,4 with original music composed in 1983 by Mark Hayes of Kansas City, Missouri.

Teach Me, Lord is a text and composition of John Purifoy, who has had a distinguished career in Christian music. Currently Mr. Purifoy is a freelance composer, arranger, and producer, living in Knoxville, Tennessee with his wife, Vicki. **Debbie Daniel**, our soprano soloist, is a member or our church choir, and Health Services manager for AstraZeneca.

God of Grace was written by Henry Emerson Fosdick, a famous and popular American Baptist preacher of the past century, for the opening of the Riverside Church in New York City. This congregation sat on the borders of Harlem and was a congregation that faced many addictions, cultures, lifestyles and troubles. They knew that the only way they would survive was by God's grace and guidance. A setting of this hymn by the American Lutheran composer, Paul Manz, is played to end today's service.

Our Church History in 1975

This year we are celebrating our church's 50th anniversary. Each week this page will continue to honor the events and people in our past history. Our focus this week is on 1975.

In the US political scene, Watergate came to a close with the conviction of John N. Mitchell, H. R. Halderman, John D. Ehrlichman. The Vietnam war came to an end with the fall of Saigon. President Gerald Ford survived a second assassination attempt. Bill Gates used the word "micro-soft" (for microcomputer software) in a letter to a friend and the next year it became the registered trademark, Microsoft. Two TV shows that are still around today, Wheel of Fortune and Saturday Night Live, premiered on NBC.

1975 was the eleventh year of this congregation. The church was a busy place. **Don Bostian** was still the senior pastor and much loved by the congregation, with **Walt Sherman** and **Terry Carlisle** as associate pastors. **Rosayle Kelley** was the Bible instructor and **Jerry Mohler** the church secretary. **Carl Cotter** retired as the church custodian and the hospital sent **Margaret Powell** to fill the position. Her self-appointed job every morning was to change the signs in the foyers listing the activities of the day.

The debt for Spring Valley Academy was nearing retirement, except for the need to rebuild the roof, and the church was anxious to complete the construction of the "wrap around" voted in December '74 (the fellowship hall, kitchen, church offices and Sabbath School rooms that surround the sanctuary). **Elliot Fortner**, then President of Sycamore Hospital, and **Dr. Louis Turner** divided the congregation into 12 giving groups to help pay off the debt incurred.

The church was visited by a number of well-known guests: **Roland Hegsted**, religious liberty secretary from the General Conference, spent a weekend here. **Glen Coon** held a 9-day seminar on the ABC's of prayer. Musical guests included the **King's Heralds** in March, **Virginia Gene Rittenhouse** and her newly-formed New England Youth Ensemble. **Dr. Warren Becker**, Andrews University organist came in April. The **Rosedale Chorale** gave their second concert in May. **John Jacob Niles**, composer of the famous Christmas Carol, *I Wonder As I Wander*, at age 83 held the audience "spellbound" in his presentation. The church choir under the direction of **Stanley Applegate** presented Dubois' *Seven Last Words of Christ*.

There were a couple of "new" events that began in 1975 that would be with us for many years to come. The Bach Society of Dayton was formed by Richard Benedum and chose our church as the place to give their first concert. Today they still consider our church as their home base. **D.A.R.E** (Dayton Area Recreational Endeavor) was started for 4th – 6th grade boys, and would continue for almost 30 years.

We were going places as well. **Kathy Neufeld (Boyd)** went as a student missionary to Zambia, Africa; her report to the church appeared monthly in the newsletter. **Al and Betty Brendel** started the "Marriage Enrichment Program" that would soon take them around the nation. The Dedication Singers, patterned after the Heritage Singers, bought amplification equipment and began traveling every weekend giving concerts. A backpack trip for Fathers and Sons/Daughters was very successful.

The highlight in December was an enhanced presentation of the annual Handel's "Messiah" sing-in, combining the Kettering Church choir, the Hospital choirs, the Normandy United Methodist Church Choir and players from the Dayton Philharmonic together, all under the direction of William Rish.

The year ended with a festive New Year's Eve party for youth!
