Committed to a Relationship with Christ

Devotions and Journaling

You are expected to have a prayer and devotional time at least 2-3 times a week. You will be journaling this time (I will give you ideas and examples of how to do this) for accountability and as a spiritual discipline. Getting in the Word is one of the most important aspects of a growing relationship with Christ. This time will allow God to speak to you as you seek his help and guidance.

Lead 360 Meetings

The Lead 360 Team will meet once a month on Sunday afternoons from 10:45 a.m.-12:30 p.m. Lunch will be provided at the meetings. Participation in the meetings is required to be a part of the Lead 360 Team. Most meetings will take place the third week of the month (unless a holiday or another circumstance causes it to be moved).

Ministry Opportunities

Please select which ministry opportunities you would like to participate in. You may select more than one if you wish, but we will eventually narrow it down to one together.

Service Project Team

This team is responsible for planning and organizing service opportunities that the participants of *VIBE* can experience. There will be one major service project planned every semester, as well as some possible ongoing projects. Members of this team will be contacting service organizations, working within the frame of the budget and youth ministry calendar to organize service projects, and communicating and advertising the service opportunities. Service Project coordinators should be organized and have a heart for service. Members of this team will meet one time every month on Sundays from 4:00-5:00 p.m.

Drama Team

This team will find/write and produce skits, dramas, and sketches for use during *VIBE*. Members of this team are responsible to work with the teaching schedule to plan the skits/dramas (approximately 1-2 every month). Drama Team members should be confident “up-front”, have a love for acting, and have artistic creativity. This team will meet 1-2 times every month on Sundays from 3:45-5:00 p.m.

Worship Team

Members of this team will lead students at *VIBE* in a time of music. Members should already have some instrument or singing ability, or have a desire to learn media and sound. This team will plan the songs to be played, and will also find new music. Worship Team members should be confident “up front”. The Worship Team will meet weekly on Sundays from 3:45-5:00 p.m. for practice.

Greeter/Follow-up Team

This team is responsible to greet students at *VIBE*, man the registration table (for new students), take attendance, follow-up with new students and absent students, and keep up the youth ministry database. The follow-up will be done via pre-stamped postcards to be sent out during the week. Members of this team should have administrative and organization skills, as well as a friendly and hospitable demeanor. This team will meet every Sunday at 5:00 p.m. for prayer.

Game Team

This team is responsible for finding/developing and leading fun activities and games for *VIBE*. Members from the team will also be responsible to collect any props that are needed to be used during the games. Members of this team should be confident “up-front” and be organized. This team will meet every Sunday at 4:45 p.m. to finalize the details for the game that night and plan the game for the following week.
