The crisis of homelessness has been in the news because of the encampments along the Santa Ana River in Anaheim. Tragically this is not news. Homelessness at various levels is a problem in most communities. The latest survey done in the county showed an increase of 7.6 % over the survey done in 2015. That figure represents 4,792 people who are experiencing homelessness. Fortunately, a little over two thousand of those folks are in temporary or transitional shelters. The rest are living on the streets.

I participate in a "Faith Based" gathering of La Habra Pastors and other leaders. This group is partnering with the City of La Habra and a Not-for-profit group called City Net, to address the issue of homelessness in our community. Our city government is proactive in addressing homelessness.

Homelessness congers up many images for us. We may see pictures from "encampments" like the one in Anaheim. For some the image involves the people who pan-handle along freeway entrances. We may even have a more immediate picture because of individuals who sometimes find "shelter" under a bush on our church property.

Whatever your image is we should all understand that the causes of homelessness are complex. Mental health and/or substance abuse remains a huge factor. For many the loss of a job, coupled with living close to poverty already, is enough. We hear that some people "choose" to be homeless. I don't doubt that this is true, but sometimes it is true because there is no other choice available. Affordable housing is an issue. (And that is also a very complex problem.)

The most recent information (and this is very reliable) indicates that there are approximately 100 people within La Habra who are "street-level" homeless. In addition, the local schools keep track of the number of families that are "at risk" of homelessness. In some cases, this means that families are living in someone's garage, or in a motel room. The schools count about 250 families in this category.

This represents a lot of people. But it is not an insurmountable problem. City Net, in concert with the La Habra Police, have been helping some of these folks into more stable living situations. So far they have helped 22 individuals move off of the streets.

The city, with the help of City Net, churches, the police, and others, are tackling this issue. I brought this concern to our last Church Council meeting and asked if the La Habra United Methodist Church wanted to be part of the solution. They answered YES. In the coming months there will be specific needs that we will be asked to help with. We will be asked to offer help only in situations where we have the capacity to respond.

The goal is to move all of La Habra's homeless or at risk persons into stable housing. City Net has discovered that working with individuals and families, with the support of local people, can end homelessness.

I'll be sharing additional information about our participation in the coming months. If you have a heart to be part of our congregation's helping team, please let me know.


Preschool News.....
