



We can have confidence that God is always at work, and always in the midst of the things that are happening, even when we can't see him. Where are we looking? Do we remember what he's done? In this passage, God was at work even when all hope seemed to be lost and those in the story were surprised by his faithfulness and provision.

Opening Question:

Share about a time in your life when you experienced genuine surprise.

Read: Exodus 2:1-10

What most resonated with you from the sermon/passage? Was there anything in particular that stood out to you from the worship experience that communicated the presence or faithfulness of God?

Where did you experience God's presence this week?

Understanding the Story:

What motivates the Levite woman to hide her baby in a basket and place him in the Nile?

Where do you see God orchestrating events in this story? What do we learn about his character?

Living the Story:

As you think back over your journey with God what awareness do you have of His orchestration of your own story? Share a specific story or incident where you noticed his presence.

Do you think you're more likely or less likely to be aware of how God is at work in other people and other communities than in your life and your community? Why might this be?

Pray:

Pray together as a small group and ask God where He is working in our own community that he wants you to notice and join? What do you sense/hear as you pray and listen together?
