The paraments on the altar and pulpit, along with the ministers' stoles provide us with visual cues about the meaning of our faith. Today is Ascension Sunday when we celebrate Christ's return to heaven and resumption of his unity with God. The color of the day is white, symbolic of Christ's sovereignty and his compassionate rule over our lives. The Celtic Cross with its circle symbolizes the sacrificial love and eternal nature of God. The Acolyte brings light to the altar as a reminder of Christ, the Light of life, and leads us out of the sanctuary as a reminder that we take this light to the world. In the same way, we begin and end our worship following the cross as a symbol of God's self-giving love for us all.

ABOUT THE ANTHEM

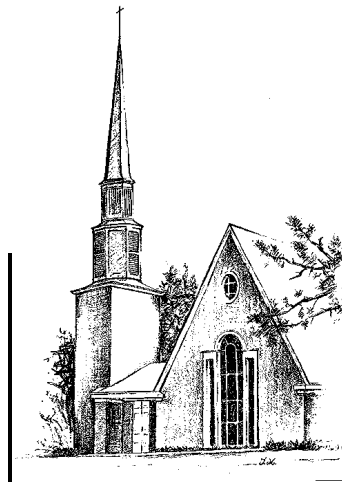
Human characteristics are often used to describe and understand God. God the Father, Provider, Protector, and Sustainer, are more masculine in nature while God the Holy Spirit as caring, comforting, and loving has a more motherly, feminine feel. Julian of Norwich wrote, "As surely as God is our Father, just as surely is he our Mother." Bobby McFerrin composed this morning's setting of the Psalm 23 in dedication to his mother. Written in the style of Anglican chant, the music and the feminine-oriented text reflect a kind, gentle God who "restores my soul, leads in the path of good things, and fills my heart with song."
