BENEVOLENT OFFERING

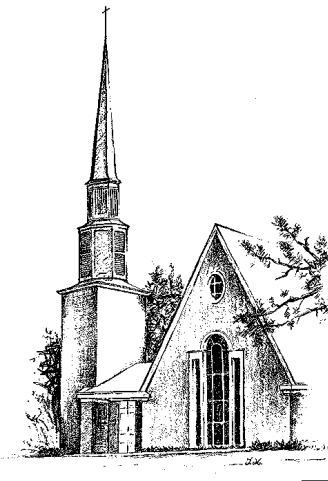
