DO YOU REMEMBER ... DID YOU KNOW?

Going back 60 years–February and March of 1955–Lakeside's journey began. Chapter 1: "The Journey Begins" from *Window on the World, A Life of Lakeside Baptist Church* by Daphne H. O'Brien (2005) goes into much detail of the early years of our church. (Books are still available in the church office for \$25 a copy.) A few excerpts from the book:

•February 13, 1955, between Sunday School and Worship, conversation among a group of young men at First Baptist Church turned to establishing a mission in the area around West Haven, the City Lake and Englewood. Austin Robbins scheduled a meeting to explore the possibility of such a mission.

•February 20, one week later, the Robbins's home was the site of that meeting.

•February 27, there was a meeting with the Board of Deacons at First Baptist Church to present a resolution of the goals of Lakeside mission and to ask for the "blessings and the assurance of cooperation" from First Baptist.

•March 20, 153 people attended a general organizational meeting at Rocky Mount Senior High School. First Baptist "wholeheartedly gave their Blessing with their Prayers to the endeavor." There was a unanimous vote to establish the mission.

I was not present at this meeting, but I well remember the enthusiasm of my parents, Marian and Riddick Martin, for a new church in our area. Maybe I would be able to walk to church! And I knew I would have many friends (like Barbara Hayworth Gonzalez, a dear friend to this day) who would go to the same church.

On this Friday, March 20, 2015, may each of us pause, reflect and be thankful for the interest, sacrifices and dedication of Lakeside's founders.
