SALLIE BAILEY TO BE COMMISSIONED FOR SUMMER INTERNSHIP

Sallie Bailey, a freshman at Virginia Commonwealth University, has been accepted as an intern with the CHAT (Church Hill Activities and Tutoring) program for the summer. She and her fellow interns will live, minister, and worship in one of Richmond's most challenging neighborhoods for the summer months. Sallie explains her reasons for choosing this ministry in these words: "I have built incredible relationships with many of the kids and volunteers, and have come to realize that CHAT is about much more than academic assistance. It is about intentionally becoming a part of the lives of children who often lack positive adult role models. The volunteers come to CHAT to help, to learn, to discipline, to minister, and to engage with the children about whom we have grown to care so deeply."

It is always both exciting to watch our young people as they grow up and begin discovering their interests and abilities. It is especially gratifying to see the ways in which the youth of this congregation match their gifts with the needs they see around them. Sallie is a gifted artist. She draws, paints, and dances. She is also abundantly compassionate and caring. She feels that God has called her to this ministry for the summer and we will affirm that calling this Sunday when we offer our blessing to her during worship.

During the Sunday School hour on April 15, Sallie, a colleague, and one of the children from CHAT will speak to the Discussion Class about her summer ministry.
