JOURNEY TO ADULTHOOD PILGRIMAGE

As part of their Journey To Adulthood experience, eleven of Lakeside's high school youth will take part in a pilgrimage to San Francisco this week. The group will depart on Friday afternoon and return next Thursday morning. In those six days, they will have an opportunity to experience a beautiful city and visit at least 14 different religious sites. We will begin on Saturday by attending Mass at Mission Dolores, the historic mission which founded San Francisco. On Sunday morning, we will worship at both Glide Memorial and Annunciation Greek Orthodox Cathedral. In addition to these times of worship, we will have tours and dialogue with members of the Buddhist Church of San Francisco, the Scientology Center, the Vedanta (Hindu) Temple, the Islamic Society of S.F. (where we will also join in a Ramadan meal), the Bahai Center, Congregation Shearith Israel, Holy Virgin Russian Orthodox Cathedral, the St. John Coltrane African Orthodox Church and a Sikh Temple. We will also tour the National Shrine of Saint Francis of Assisi. Our journey will end by walking and praying the labyrinth at Grace Cathedral. Each evening, we will take time to explore what we have experienced and consider how encountering people of other faiths has helped us better to understand our own.

You will have opportunities to hear about our travels in the Discussion Class later in the summer and at a Fellowship Supper in September.
