DO YOU REMEMBER---DID YOU KNOW?

This week, we feature remembrances from three people who still have vivid memories of those first worship services at Lakeside.

From Margaret Carpenter, charter member as a young wife and mother (Margaret was also church secretary from 1963 to 1988):

"When Mac and I moved to Rocky Mount in 1953, we started attending the First Baptist Church. When we learned that a new church was being organized we immediately joined with other interested people, especially since it would be closer to the Englewood area where we were living. We attended as many of the organizational meetings as we could and we were thrilled when the Skeels Building was purchased. From day one we felt right at home. I remember when our interim minister, Dr. Kincheloe, and our first minister, Mr. Godwin, would have to stand in the doorway between two rooms and deliver the sermon, turning to look and speak to one group and then turning and speaking to the other. I'm not sure if everyone got all of the sermon or not but at least all of us got a part of it! No one seemed to mind because this was our very own church. The Skeels Building had been a school at one time and we felt like we were learning as we went along. By the time we moved into the Kincheloe Building, we were family. We cleaned floors, washed windows, polished furniture, raked the yard, whatever we had to do, because we were so proud of our church. I believe that tradition has continued to this day, with all the activities that go on at Lakeside. We are still proud of our church and we are still family."

From Ann Overton Winstead, charter member as a teenager:

"Dr. Kincheloe came with us from First Baptist to Lakeside as we all moved into the Skeels Building which was more a home than a kindergarten. Church services were definitely a challenge for the minister who had to stand in the doorway and look from left to right from one room to another to deliver his sermon. It made no difference, we were happy to be together with our friends."

From Marshall Henry, son of Nancy and Webster Henry (charter members) as a 9-year-old:

When Dr. Kincheloe delivered his "fire and brimstone" Baptist sermons, he stood in the doorway of a room the size of a small classroom, facing it as well as a couple of adjacent rooms, all of which served as our "sanctuary" until we could build one. We were overflowing with worshippers from the "git go!"

Isn't it interesting what an impression the room arrangement, concern for the difficulty of delivering the sermon, and the pride in a new church "home" made to all three people? We observe that such concern and pride is still with us 60 years later.
