DO YOU REMEMBER . . . DID YOU KNOW?

As we prepare to celebrate our 60th Anniversary on June 7, we recall some of the good memories that have been created at Lakeside over the past six decades.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH CHOIRS

How can one think "Lakeside" and not think music? Music memories abound starting with Lakeside's youth choir. Did you know that the youth choir (formed in June 1955) was the ONLY choir until the Kincheloe Building was completed?

Lakeside's youth music program continued to grow, and Sue Overton Daughety, (daughter of charter members J.B. and Carolyn Overton) remembers youth choir, under the direction of May Lou Nicholson in 1963, with practice every Monday afternoon and singing most Sunday nights. They had no sheet music or special arrangements for children—they sang straight from *The Baptist Hymnal*. Sue's favorite was "The Old Rugged Cross." Along with her music memories go memories of friendship with Linda Boone Davis, Lottie "Sister" Gurganus, Teen and Lucy Mayo, Jill Carpenter Ward, Karen Vann, Marsha Allen, but few boys.

Moving into early 2000, Marybeth Wallace (Lakeside member 1989-2005) remembers:

"Lakeside's vibrant music program has always been cause for celebration: even now I can hear jubilant strains of 'All God's Critters got a Place in the Choir' and picture Dianne Willcox Bulluck conducting the enthusiastic Lakeside children, swaying to the music with a smile on her face. Fortunately for my daughters (Catherine Stuart and Elizabeth), Dianne and Jerry Jolley cared more about volume and participation than they did their singing on key—and with that philosophy they welcomed every child who wanted to sing to be part of the choir . . . 'Some just clap their hands, paws, or anything they got now . . .'" Marybeth Wallace

In 2015, youth music programs continue to grow and witness under the direction of Amy Shortt, our Minister of Music since 2010. The Children's Choir (grades K-5) not only sings in worship, but they also take their talents into the community. Last year the Children's Choir sang 18 times in worship, did two flashmobs (Braswell Library and Harris Teeter) and most recently performed for Missions Marketplace. They also sang for the Nash General Hospital Lights of Love program as well as caroling for our Members-at-Home. Amy's direction has brought the talented Youth Choir (grades 6-12) to singing 3-and 4-part anthems with grace and skill. We should all be excited that Lakeside continues to offer a great music ministry to our young people.

CHURCH-WIDE PICNIC

Follow Old Carriage Road to Bend of the River Road. Turn right onto Bend of the River Road (You will see Reservoir Country Store and Mt. Herman Baptist Church). Turn right onto Joyner Road (the first paved road on the right). Then make a sharp right onto Sapony Trail (the first paved road on the right). The address is 6313 Sapony Trail. Please park on the shoulder of the road and not in the yard. (PLEASE NOTE: There is a Sapony Creek Drive off Old Carriage Road. Do not take this route!)
