DO YOU REMEMBER . . . DID YOU KNOW?

As we prepare to celebrate our 60th Anniversary on June 7, we recall some of the good memories that have been created at Lakeside over the past six decades.

YOUTHFUL MEMORIES—THEN AND NOW

Sunday School influenced Lakeside's early youth in different ways: Ann Overton Winstead "spent many wonderful years under the tutelage of teachers such as Miss Norma and Miss Joyce Cuthrell in a class for girls." Marshall Henry "skipped a boys' Sunday School most Sundays back then—never alone but with a buddy or two—and would go over to the City Lake to joke and play. They always watched the church to be sure to be back in time so their parents would not know." Surely—no perfect attendance pins for those boys!

In 1966, Lakeside decided to try co-ed classes for 7th graders. This decision, a deviation from the Baptist norm, soon led to co-ed classes for all ages. Linda Boone Davis experienced it all—"co-ed classes with Corbett Rushing in the Youth Room and with Walter Early who held class at the City Lake on nice days." Today Sunday School is organized by grades for youth and by interest groups for adults.

Sunday Night Worship Service included youth participation—the youth choir sang and the high school boys served as ushers. Bill Waters remembers, "when we walked back down the aisle after placing the offering on the altar, we would sometimes keep on walking out the back door. Maybe nobody would notice? MY DADDY DID!" This is the same Bill Waters (charter member and son of charter members, Bill, Sr. and Mary C. Waters, and husband of Betsy) who in 1962 was the first minister ordained at Lakeside and was minister in 3 churches before retiring back to Rocky Mount and Lakeside. Sunday night services were discontinued at the end of the 60's decade.

Singspiration was the final Sunday evening activity for youth in the early 1960s. After choir practice, bag supper, BTU and evening worship, the youth gathered in a private home for refreshments, fellowship and lots of singing. Memories abound of those Sunday nights in February, 1964, when the highlight was being in a home with COLOR television to watch the Beatles on The Ed Sullivan Show. Those nights, "Kumbaya" and "Do Lord Remember Me" were no competition for "I Want to Hold Your Hand."

Today, children and youth enjoy activities every Sunday evening including choir, Bible and missions study, and supper.
