DO YOU REMEMBER . . . DID YOU KNOW?

As we prepare to celebrate our 60th Anniversary on June 7, we recall some of the good memories that have been created at Lakeside over the past six decades.

1970's MUSIC MEMORIES

Did you know that Lakeside had a singing group???

As I recall, every Sunday afternoon, the church parking lot would be filled with about 15-25 youth. Depending upon the season, we organized softball, football or basketball games. Some came to play, some came to watch and cheer, and others, like Barbara Scott always brought her guitar. Then Jerry Parker started bringing his. When the games were over, we sat around in the grass and sang until it was time for the "official" youth programs to start. Back then they separated the junior highs from the senior highs, but not when it came to singing.

One Sunday night, on stage, we sang some songs from "Jesus Christ Super Star" and "Tell it Like It Is," with guitars and tambourines—and also dressing the part—which means we were wearing blue jeans in the Sanctuary!! That was unheard of in the early 1970s.

A group of about 12 of us started hanging out on the weekends in the Attic at church or somebody's home to sing and practice. We sang popular songs from the radio from artists like Carole King, James Taylor, John Denver, The Beatles, and Simon and Garfunkel. We learned the songs pretty quickly and could harmonize with the best of them. We became known as "The Lakeside Singers" and sang at family and talent nights in the Kincheloe Hall on Sunday nights and on youth trips to Camp Kanata or Ridgecrest. We were the entertainment! Jerry always invited others to join our group when we performed, but we had no takers. That's when we started singing "It's Too Late" by Carole King. We were also invited to sing at the Westridge Swim Club for adult cookouts. We were popular!!

The Lakeside Singers were Jerry and Lynn Parker, James and Allison Biggs, Morgan and Barbara Scott, Bill Scarborough, Cheri Staton, Jan and Jaye Willcox, Ken Scalf, David Brantley, and Marsha Scott. Jerry, Morgan and Barbara played guitar, Bill played banjo, and the rest played rhythm instruments. We all sang.

The Lakeside Singers still stay in touch, and, recalling the same great memories, agree that this was a pretty special time for all of us. I guess you could call this a KUMBAYA kind of time, but I call it the roots of Lakeside, because music is Lakeside.
