DO YOU REMEMBER . . . DID YOU KNOW?

Since March 18, past and present Lakeside members have been sharing wonderful memories of their journey from our church's beginning up to the present. Reflecting on so many successful missions and the ever-generous people brings us to our June 7 celebration of the 60 years of Lakeside Baptist Church.

Below are memories from Marybeth Wallace of the years (1989-2005) that she, McLain and their daughters were members of Lakeside. By season and holiday, she has captured the Lakeside enthusiasm and outreaches that her family remembers.

"When I asked my girls (Catherine Stuart and Elizabeth) what they remember most fondly about Lakeside, it is clear that each season and each holiday holds special memories: the picnic lunch and Easter egg hunt on the crisp Lakeside lawn each Spring; Summer Vacation Bible School and Gatekeeper's Workcamp & the camaraderie shared in an extraordinary week of repairing homes and uplifting spirits; amid the colorful Fall leaves, the Halloween Festival and making miniature gingerbread Halloween Houses; November brought the Thanksgiving Feast to the Lakeside Preschool, with the tradition of painting faces, threading macaroni necklaces, and dressing up like Native Americans, dwelling in teepees and riding an ever-patient pony; and Christmas included the glorious music services (Handel's "Hallelujah Chorus" most prominently) and caroling followed by supper at Angie Hunter's house. Ecclesiastes tells us "to everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under heaven" and Lakeside knows this well. It is in each of these seasons and special traditions that our children's memories of a lifetime are created. And it is the people of Lakeside sharing in those traditions together, caring about each other and about making their community a better place that our children learn the most valuable lessons of all." As we read Marybeth's words and look to our future, we should all ask ourselves: What do we want on our Lakeside calendar? How do we continue to teach valuable lessons? Where is God leading us in our ministry? We continue to ask God to "Be Thou our Vision . . ."
