MUSIC NOTES

On Sunday, the Chancel Choir will sing "Come to Me All Pilgrim's Thirsty," written by a Sister Delores Dufner, a well-known hymn writer of today. When asked about her inspiration for writing this hymn, Sister Dufner wrote:

"This text was inspired primarily by the lengthy dialogue between Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well (John 4). When she questioned Jesus about his request for a drink, he responded 'If you only knew what God is offering' Jesus' words to her might well be addressed to each of us: if we really understood the good that God wants to do for us, we would come to Christ gladly and freely to find life, refreshment, and forgiveness. These gifts are offered in a special way at the Eucharistic table. I drew on two other scripture texts for this hymn. The first is John 7:37-39, in which Jesus cries out, 'let anyone who is thirsty come to me and let the one who believes in me drink.' The second is Matthew 11:28-30, in which Jesus invites the weary and heavily burdened to come to him for rest, 'for my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.'" (Westermeyer, p. 644) The verses of this anthem, sung to the familiar tune BEACH SPRING, offer Jesus' invitation for all to come to the table. The refrain is our response always ending "in the gracious gift you offer, there is joy no tongue can tell."
