As the end of a fiscal year approaches, some businesses can boost their bottom line by selling a few more widgets or by drastically cutting expenses, often eliminating valuable positions and depriving someone of a livelihood. Churches, however, depend solely on the generosity of their members and friends to meet expenses. We have talked a lot about generosity over the past couple of years, primarily about how God's generosity toward us is a model for our own understanding of generosity. God's love toward us is a love of abundance, not scarcity. The ways in which we demonstrate our love for God and one another ought to also emerge from a sense of abundance rather than an attitude of scarcity.

How fortunate we are to have a generous congregation. Year after year, project after project, ministry after ministry, you respond to the needs placed before you. Thank you for the faithfulness and commitment you have to our ministry.

In 2015, we received \$625,863 in offerings. Approximately \$700 in other funds were received for a projected total of \$626,563 toward our Ministry Plan of \$637,111. Although we did not reach our goal, because our spending for the year should prove to be less than anticipated, we are confident that we have met all of our expenses. Well done!

Now it is time to undergird a new year of ministry. If you have not yet returned your Giving Plan Card, please do so. If you have not been as generous as you could be, please consider increasing your giving to our church. The investment we make in the lives of people is enormous. The results of our ministry are obvious. And the call of the Gospel rings clear for us all. Thank you for a wonderful 2015. Blessings for a phenomenal 2016!
