## PRAYERFUL SERVICE: HARP MUSIC, HEALING, AND HELP

The flooding following Hurricane Matthew brings back memories of the horrific flooding that came our way with Hurricane Floyd in 1999. It also reminds us of the many ways our community united to help one another and to rebuild our city. Once again, we have the opportunity to help our neighbors.

Our friend, harpist Anita Burroughs-Price, has offered to come to our area and play her harp as a ministry of calming grace to people whose lives are in turmoil. Anita will be in our sanctuary at noon on Thursday, October 13, to offer a thirty-minute concert of harp music. You may come and listen, meditate, and pray. We also invite you to bring canned food (pop-top lids a plus) and non-perishable food items, toiletries/hygiene items, diapers and baby wipes, cleaning supplies, pillows, towels, and socks to be distributed to the evacuation shelters in our area. Following the concert, Anita will travel to Tarboro to play for the residents of the memory unit at the Fountains of the Albemarle who were also evacuated.
