SUNSET AVENUE BRIDGE CLOSURE

The North Carolina Department of Transportation has begun work on widening Hwy 301. The bridges on Sunset Avenue which cross over Hwy 301 will be replaced and that portion of the roadway will be closed beginning October 16. In order to reach the church, we suggest taking May Drive off of 301 (beside Ichiban Japanese Steakhouse), Rose Drive off of 301 (at Dunkin Donuts), or travel down Bethlehem Road to Hammond Street and Piedmont Avenue. The bridges will be closed until December 2018.
