## MUSIC NOTES

Sunday's worship music was stylistically diverse yet similar in purpose. "Salmo 150," is a Latin text of the psalm that calls us to "Praise the Lord in the sanctuary, in the firmament and according to his mighty greatness! Praise God with trumpet, lute, harp, tambourine and dance, with strings and pipes." This text encourages all to praise the Lord: "Let EVERYTHING that has breath praise the Lord." "We Are Singing for the Lord is our Light" includes English and Zulu texts, two very different languages that call us to sing together, differences and all. "Lord, Have Mercy," written in soulful style, is an earnest plea for help that unites us as we lift one another up in prayer. The act of mercy itself somehow brings people together. Using contrasting musical styles to celebrate World Communion was a powerful way to experience the message of unity. When you sing, it doesn't matter how old or young, tall or short, rich or poor you are. Music does not consider who you love, the color of your skin, or where you are from. What matters is that you sing.

This year, we are focusing our primary efforts on our local shelters for the homeless and victims of domestic abuse. Please choose one of the following projects:

- My Sister's House
  - Install seventeen towel bars.
  - Install a soaker hose in the Meditation Garden.
- United Community Ministries Shelter
  - Landscaping side yard.
  - Installing mural and painting trim on the outside wall of the shelter.
- Assisting the Lakeside children in creating a craft for missions gifts and assisting them with performance at United Community Ministries shelter.
- Taking portraits of families at the Bassett Center.
- Assisting the Lakeside Youth with community park clean-up.
- Filling comfort care kits for children for the Frederick E. Turnage Chapter of the American Red Cross.
- Making and/or delivering soup to fellow church members.
- Baking and/or delivering cookies to fellow church members.
- Making "no-sew" lap blankets for Pediatric patients at Nash General Hospital.
- Preparing "Luke's Dream Pillows" in memory of Luke Spencer for children at My Sister's House and the Pediatric Emergency Department at Nash General Hospital.

- Donating new or gently used, hardcover children's books for the Little Free Libraries. At this time, we do not need any more adult books.
