DISTINGUISHED SPEAKER SERIES AT LAKESIDE

We are delighted to announce the establishment of “The Frederick E. Turnage Distinguished Speaker Series at Lakeside: Conversations on Christian Citizenship” thanks to a generous gift from the Turnage family and friends of the late Fred Turnage. This annual event will bring well known speakers to Rocky Mount to help us explore the various ways in which we might live out our faith as citizens of our community. The series will seek out experts with vast experience in the church, public service, business, education, the arts, the sciences, non-profit organizations, and other areas of our common life.

Fred Turnage was a life-long resident of Rocky Mount, an attorney who served citizens of this region, and mayor of our city for thirty-four years. He was also a member of Lakeside for over fifty years and served in many leadership capacities. This series will blend the two passions in Fred’s life: concerned citizenship and faithful living.

The inaugural event will be held on January 12, 2014. We are pleased that Dr. Jonathan L. Walton, Plummer Professor of Christian Morals and Pusey Minister in the Memorial Church at Harvard University and Professor of Religion and Society at Harvard Divinity School will be our first speaker. Dr. Walton, a graduate of Morehouse College (BA in Political Science) and Princeton Theological Seminary (MDiv and PhD in Religion & Society) will preach in our worship service on January 12. He will speak again at Lakeside that afternoon and lead a discussion on Christian Citizenship. On Monday, we will offer area clergy an opportunity to visit with Dr. Walton.

More information about this event and the future series will be forthcoming. We ask you to set aside January 12 on your calendar and let friends throughout the community know of this extraordinary opportunity.
