PIPE ORGAN FUND UPDATE

For four years now we have enjoyed the wonderful gift of our Casavant pipe organ and the enhancements to the sanctuary which accompanied it. The donors who gifted us with the organ and everyone who contributed to the overall project have been most generous and we are grateful.

The balance of the loan for the organ is now at \$17,000. Approximately \$6,000 in pledged gifts is expected to be given. We have \$4,115 in the money market fund from which we have paid the loan. These funds will leave a balance of \$6,885 to pay off the loan. If you would like to make an initial or additional gift to the Pipe Organ Fund, we invite you to do so by the end of April.
