

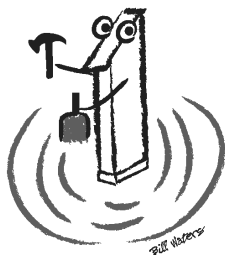

Our 22<sup>nd</sup> year of Gatekeepers Workcamp is off to a great start! This year's theme, based on Romans 12:4-8, is "The Power of One Can Make a Difference," and helps us to focus on how we can discover our gifts and use them in harmony with those of our brothers and sisters in Christ in order to make a difference in our world. This week 8 crews made up of 104 youth and nearly 50 adults plan to make repairs and improvements for elderly and disabled homeowners throughout the Rocky Mount

community.
