BIG ADVENTURES IN THE BIG APPLE

On Sunday morning, seven of our youth and four adults boarded an Amtrak train for New York City. Our first days here have been amazing as we have spent most of our time working with the youth and leaders of Fresh Youth Initiatives.

FYI is an organization that works with children and youth from the Washington Heights neighborhood of northern Manhattan, supporting and encouraging them to “design and carry out community service projects, develop leadership skills, fulfill their potential, and realize their dreams.” We spent Monday getting to know and playing games with the older elementary children at FYI’s day camp and learning some of the history of Washington Heights. On Tuesday, we did some painting in the FYI building, organized the craft room and books for the reading center, and made cards for families who will receive food boxes. On Wednesday and Thursday we will accompany the children to the park and swimming pool and continue to help with projects at the center.

Our evenings are spent seeing the sights and getting to know various neighborhoods in the City, including taking in a Yankees game, walking across the Brooklyn Bridge, visiting the 9/11 Museum, and worshipping at Riverside Church.

I am grateful for the Lakeside youth who are on this trip. Madi Adkins, Alaya Banks, Andersen Cobb, Reynolds Cobb, Spencer Edwards, Sara Raper, and Jacob Watkins work hard, strengthen connections within the group, build relationships with new friends, and remain open to new experiences.
