#### GATEKEEPERS WORKCAMP 22ND YEAR

Have you ever considered the needs in our world, or those right here in our own community, wanting to help but feeling overwhelmed by the enormity of it all? Have you ever looked in the face of these challenges and wondered, "How can I make a difference?"

In his letter to the Romans, Paul wrote about the impact we can make for God's Kingdom in our world if we each use the gifts God has given us, in harmony with the gifts of others and through the work of the Holy Spirit.
