GATEKEEPERS WORKCAMP JULY 9-14, 2017

In the midst of political upheaval and the threat of invasion from the Assyrian Empire, many Israelites had retreated to the “safe” place of religious legalism and strict ritual observance but were treating their neighbors, especially the poor and vulnerable among them, with contempt. God spoke through the prophet

Micah to call his people back to building a life that is pleasing to God, not based on religious piety or doctrinal purity but on these simple but never-easy requirements: do justice, love kindness, walk humbly (Micah 6:8).

In the coming week, about 100 youth and over 50 adults will seek to live out Micah’s challenge to all people of faith as we repair homes and build relationships throughout our community. Thanks to the generosity of the Lakeside family, we have been able to offer scholarships to ten youth whose families are unable to afford the registration. We are also grateful to the many of you who are giving time and contributions for our cookout, lunches, refreshments, and on crews.
