Several small but important steps were taken this summer to help us get to know our neighbors and become more of a presence in our neighborhood. With the support of our congregation, the Neighborhood Ministry Team hosted a City Lake Neighborhood cookout, sponsored an ice cream social for National Night Out, and provided a summer feeding and reading site for children in our neighborhood. Bites and Books volunteers served 277 lunches this summer, as well as shared the enjoyment of reading with the children who were fed.

A new school year has begun and we are hoping to expand our Bites and Books ministry by offering an after-school tutoring and enrichment program to children in grades 3-5. On Monday and Thursday afternoons from 3:30-5:30 p.m., volunteers are needed to provide healthy snacks, supervise and help children with homework, or lead a lesson in the creative arts (singing, piano, art, dance, cooking, woodworking, etc.).
