Casa Rosa Makes a Difference!

Recently, the Casa Rosa Board has received thank you letters from clients that brought tears to our eyes and swelled our hearts with gladness. Actually we constantly receive thank you's, hugs, smiles, and laughter, but these letters were exceptional because the clients said that we had changed their lives. As we have grown as a community, we have included more clients as volunteers, empowering them as people who have something to give, as well as to receive. We find that everyone has something to give.



It feels good to help others, so you should feel really good, your contributions mean so much. Contributions of money help us to buy food—remember the 9 to 1 principle. We are able to buy \$9 worth of food for each dollar contributed. Donations of clean, attractive, casual clothing are much appreciated also. “Thanks to your clothing bank I have been able to get much needed and beautiful clothing,” commented one individual. How nice it is to have attractive clothing. Household goods are always in demand as well. When you buy something new, think about giving away your still good appliances, dishes, or whatever, rather than storing them in the garage or closets.

We have made some recent repairs and improvements. Tom L and Matt G installed tile in our kitchen, replacing the soiled and worn out carpeting. The tile is easier to keep clean and so much nicer. We have upgraded our refrigerators and freezers when people have given us newer used appliances. This helps us to better serve our clients. We are constantly looking for ways to improve what we are doing. We welcome approximately 55 families each Saturday. A family might include one person, four or five, or even more. Nearly every week, we will sign up a new family or two; some people move away; old friends may return. The people who arrive on any given weekend are given a warm welcome, food and more.

MEMBER PROFILE

JANICE L

Janice was born in Chicago and lived there until she went to Hanover College in Hanover, Indiana, where



she graduated with a degree in English and a minor in Theology. Janice spent one summer working at Ghost Ranch, and this was her introduction to New Mexico. After graduation she returned to New Mexico to teach at Madison Junior High in Albuquerque, where she taught 9th grade English for five years.

After marrying and spending a year in California, she returned to teach English at Del Norte for four years. When her husband earned his geology degree from the University of New Mexico, they moved to Houston for three years, where he worked for Texas Gulf Oil. Their two daughters, Morgan and Whitney, were born there. With moves to Midland, TX, back to Albuquerque, and back to Midland, the family finally re-settled in New Mexico in 1987.

While in Midland, Janice earned her Master's degree in Education and Reading at University of Texas, Permian Basin branch in Odessa, TX. After the family returned to New Mexico in 1987, Janice taught 11th grade English at Valley High School in Albuquerque from 1988-2000. She divorced in 1990, and in 2000, with her children grown, she decided she really wanted to be a librarian. So she went to library school in Denton, TX for two years, earning her second Master's degree.

She returned to teaching at Valley High School for two more years because there were no librarian positions in Albuquerque. However, the day after retiring from Albuquerque Public Schools in 2004, she saw an ad in the paper for a librarian position at Cuba High School. She interviewed and was hired on the spot. She commuted to Cuba from Placitas for five years and loved her position as a librarian. Janice retired for the final time in 2009.
