

LAWRENCE ONBOARD

A New Way to Travel Around Town

Four years ago, my husband Tim and I moved out to the country to live a more sustainable lifestyle. We built a passive-solar house out of local materials, heated it with wood from the back lot, and caught rainwater off the roof. We planted a huge garden, learned to can food, and raised a flock of chickens. We bought less and shared more. And we took public transportation whenever we could. Which was never because there isn't any out where we live. So, when we needed to go to town, we did what all our neighbors did – drove our car.



Usually alone, all nine miles to Lawrence, Kansas. It's not exactly the most sustainable way to get around, but I don't feel comfortable on a bicycle and calling my neighbors for a ride is a huge hassle. So I drove. But I wasn't happy about it.

That's when I came up with the idea of Lawrence OnBoard. Which is a club of members who are vetted and registered and given an ID badge and an OnBoard Logo so people would know who they were riding with or picking up. Thus was born the Lawrence OnBoard Roadside Ridesharing Association.

The riders make their own signs indicating where they need to go and can see the logo in the drivers windshield to know they are a member.

OnBoard participants successfully got a ride 95% of the time. The average wait time for a ride was less than seven minutes. *Greenability Magazine, March/April 2014 issue*


Change the World One Daisy at a Time!
