





## LITTLE CHAPEL MISSION TRIP TO KERNERSVILLE, NC

Nine of us left on a sunny Thursday morning for Kernersville to work for the Crisis Control Ministry located



there. We were joined by Pastor Kathy Campbell from Crossnore PCUSA and four of their members. It was a pleasure working with them and so good to have the chance to strengthen our ties with the Crossnore church. We started off with a picnic, hosted by our Mission Committee. Thank you, Sharon!



Begun 41 years ago, this Christianbased ministry serves 1 in 24 residents of Forsyth County with short term emergency services. They believe that food, shelter, and medicine are basic human needs. They seek to give temporary help in crises in these three

areas. All of this is based on the foundation of many committed volunteers.

What did we do to help? We started by washing all the win-

dows inside and out of their facility in Kernersville, did some yard work for them, and also cleaned a very large vinyl banner so that they will be able to use it again.

The next day we were off to their main center in Winston-Salem where the Director gave us a tour of the facility, including their free li-




censed pharmacy. This is an amazing service they provide, giving out prescribed medications which are donated in



large part by four nearby nursing homes. These are unused medicines from their patients' prescriptions. Following this, we cleaned what would become grocery store shelves for their Client Choice Food Pantry. They even will have small grocery carts for their clients to use! Later that day, we helped collect donations to

Crisis Control Ministry by manning several business and church parking lots (in the rain!) Much parking was needed

for all the people coming to their annual street fair, the Kernersville Folly. After our shifts, we all had time to go down to the Folly for a while. Their funnel cakes are very good and so was the music!
