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

We live in an amazing era, a time of nearly limitless possibilities and potential. Most of our homes, schools, hospitals, offices, and automobiles, regardless of how dated we ascribe them to be, parade technology that would have baffled even some of the greatest minds of the last millennium; and to contemplate what advancements lie in store for our children and grandchildren can be absolutely mind-boggling. Computers, laptops, and smartphones now grant us unlimited access to virtually anything or anyone, for that matter. With those same resources, a church in the heart of the Silicon Valley can continually beam without censure God's message of love and redemption across America and around the world. All of this we enjoy in the United States, truly the land of opportunity, whose citizens and residents are assured a permanent "freedom of speech and expression, freedom of worship, freedom from want, and freedom from fear." Nevertheless, amidst all of these abundant blessings, the spirit of hopelessness is sweeping the country and has invaded even the New Testament local church. Hope is

the anticipation of good in the near, unseen future. It is the candid expectation that blessings are yet to come; however, because of financial reversals, family matters, health issues, loss of pensions or retirement, loss of employment, and other situations beyond man's control, I find that many of God's people succumb to despair.

May I remind you that hopelessness stems from within; "for as he thinketh in his heart, so is he." (Proverbs 23:7) As we dwell on defeat and discouragement, this feeling of anxiety will edge its way into our lives; but we must remember that "God hath not given us the spirit of fear." (II Timothy 1:7) We need not worry about the day ahead; our Lord has promised that He will never leave or forsake us. The same God Who wrought victories in our lives is the same God Who can bring His people through the trials they endure now. Hopelessness also comes from without. We consider the lives of others and perhaps see how our blessings pale in comparison while our injustices and burdens supposedly outweigh theirs. We convince ourselves that we are the only ones suffering and then lose all hope.

The devil also provokes feelings of hopelessness, from both within and without. On the inside, he plants negative thoughts within our minds and, on the outside, tempts us to believe that there can be no hope for our lives. Subsequently, people turn to drugs and anti-depressants, all readily available at the local pharmacy. They turn to the flesh and try to assuage their hopelessness with carnality, thus further entrapping themselves. They surrender to fear or despondency. They turn to Eastern religion or to anything else that can provide some reprieve, however temporary and garbled. The list can go on and on. God's people must understand that hope is built on God, God's presence, God's Word, God's house, and God's peace. May the words of this songwriter find an echo in our hearts:

"My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness. I dare not trust the sweetest frame but wholly lean on Jesus' name. On Christ the solid rock I stand, All other ground is sinking sand, All other ground is sinking sand."

Dear Christian, I do not know what you face today; but please do not yield to a spirit of hopelessness. In our Lord, we may renew our hope and anticipate good in the near, unseen future.



Fill My Cup, Lord

Life was never to be a bed of roses for Richard Blanchard. A severe lung problem developed, and Blanchard was left with one-third of his lung capacity. But a diminished physical well-being did not stop young Blanchard.

In 1953, he became the pastor of a church in Coral Gables, Florida, and one day, was asked by a young couple to perform their marriage ceremony. However, the couple was quite late for their counseling appointment.

Blanchard told his secretary, I will wait for thirty minutes and I'm leaving. He then went to a nearby Sunday school room and sat down to play the piano for a while. He later said, When I was not in the mood to be used of God, God was in a mood to use me. In less than thirty-minutes, as he waited for the young couple, God gave him the inspiring song Fill My Cup, Lord.

As Richard Blanchard looks back over his life, he declares even though God chose in his providence to impair my physical being, he has in so many other ways 'Fill'd My Cup.'

Camden native George Wingate reflects that growing up there "prepared me well for joining the Marines at the age of 16." As a child, he attended a small neighborhood church with his brothers and sisters. Sixteen years in the Marines brought George to places like the Philippines, Japan, Australia, Okinawa, Saudi Arabia and Kuwait. As a young recruit in boot camp, he was a Chaplain's assistant and allowed to "say a prayer before lights out." In 1984, while studying the Bible with a fellow Marine in Okinawa, Japan, George trusted Jesus Christ as his personal Saviour. Three years later he met and married his wife Kim. God has blessed them with three beautiful children.

George admits, however, that, "all the while I was battling a drinking problem that I developed in the Marines and specifically after the war in Kuwait." Last August, Kim walked into Mainland Baptist, "needing God to restore our marriage and her sanity." Ironically, their son Christopher had been invited to MBC by Damon Grego. Shortly thereafter, George began attending the Reformers Unanimous Addictions Program on Friday evenings and the Sunday morning service with his wife. Through the discipleship programs of RU and Mainland Baptist, this grateful Marine, whose favorite verse is Ecclesiastes 11:9, has "rediscovered that God can deliver you from situations and addictions that man will only punish you for." George Wingate is "very thankful to my new family here at the church and Reformers Unanimous."
